1 PROCEEDINGS MR. FELDMAN: Good afternoon. 2 We 3 are on the record. Today is Wednesday, June 14, 2023. The time is 4:06 p.m. 4 5 Welcome to today's meeting of the New York City Business Integrity Commission. 6 7 We are conducting this meeting via Microsoft Teams. This is Public 8 9 Meeting, which was duly noticed for today's date at 4 o'clock p.m., along 10 the Microsoft Teams information and 11 12 dial-in information for the meeting. 13 This meeting is being recorded and 14 the recording and meeting minutes will be posted on BIC's website following the 15 16 conclusion of the meeting. 17 I am David Feldman, Deputy Commissioner of Legal Affairs and 18 General Counsel for the Commission. 19 20 I am joined by the following Commission members: 21 2.2 Elizabeth Crotty, Commissioner and 23 Chair of the Business Integrity 24 Commission; Department of Consumer and Worker Protection, Deputy Chief of 25

14	you all for being here today.
15	Today the Commission will consider
16	three matters.
17	The first matter is a resolution to
18	hold meetings by remote means during a
19	local state of emergency proclaimed by
20	the Mayor. The second meeting is a
21	resolution regarding the use of video
22	conferencing at future Commission
23	meetings. The third matter is a denial
24	recommendation by the Commission staff
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in connection with a Registration Application. The first resolution states that it

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is a resolution of the New York City Business Integrity Commission to hold entirely remote meetings during a state disaster or emergency declared by the Governor or a local state of emergency proclaimed by the Mayor in accordance with the requirements established by the State of New York in Section 2 of Part WW of Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2022.

This resolution takes effect today 13 14 and amends the resolution previously adopted on March 14, 2023. To cite the 15 16 current Emergency Executive Order, 17 number 411 dated May 20, 2023, in which 18 the local state of emergency first 19 declared by the Mayor in Emergency Executive Order number 98 dated 20 21 March 12, 2020, was extended through 22 June 19, 2023 to address the threat and 23 impact of COVID-19 in the City of New 24 York. 25 In adopting the resolution, the

determines, in accordance with Section			
103-a(3) of the New York Open Meetings			
Law, that the circumstances			
necessitating the emergency declaration			
would affect or impair the ability of			
the Commission to hold in-person			
meetings and resolves that Commission			
meetings shall continue to be held by			
remote means and the in-person			
participation requirement of the OML			
shall not apply.			
Do any of the Commissioners have any			
questions or comments regarding the			
first proposed resolution?			
(No response.)			
MR. FELDMAN: Okay. Seeing none,			
the Commission will now vote as to			
whether to adopt this resolution.			
If the Commission votes "yes", the			

21 resolution will be adopted. If the 22 Commission votes "no", the resolution 23 will not be adopted. 24 Is there a motion from the

Commissioners to adopt the resolution?

1 MS. STRAUBER: Motion to adopt. 2 MR. FELDMAN: Thank you, Commissioner Strauber. 3 Is there a second? 4 MS. CROTTY: I second. 5 MR. FELDMAN: Thank you, Chair 6 7 Crotty. 8 I will be calling on each 9 Commissioner and designee to collect 10 votes. Chair Crotty? 11 12 MS. CROTTY: Yes. MR. FELDMAN: Commissioner Strauber? 13 MS. STRAUBER: Yes. 14 15 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Chief of Staff 16 Baret? 17 MS. BARET: Yes. 18 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Commissioner 19 Anderson? 20 MR. ANDERSON: Yes. 21 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy General Counsel 22 Rozen? 23 MS. ROZEN: Yes. 24 MR. FELDMAN: And Inspector Hyland? 25 MR. HYLAND: Yes.

MR. FELDMAN: Let the record reflect 1 that the vote is unanimous. 2 The resolution will note each Commissioner 3 4 and designee's vote today. 5 The second resolution states that it is a resolution of the New York City 6 7 Business Integrity Commission to authorize the use of video conferencing 8 9 to conduct Commission meetings, as authorized and in accordance with 10 Section 103-a of the New York State Open 11 12 Meetings Law. This resolution, which takes effect 13 on June 20, 2023, provides that the use 14 of video conferencing to conduct 15 16 meetings of the Business Integrity 17 Commission, is authorized in conformance 18 with the New York State Open Meetings 19 Law, including the follow: 20 One, for all Commission meetings, a number of Commissioners sufficient to 21 2.2 constitute a quorum of the Commission 23 shall be present in a physical location 24 or locations where the public can attend 25 in person.

1	And, two, if a quorum of
2	Commissioners is physically present at a
3	Commission meeting where the public can
4	attend in person, a Commissioner may
5	attend and participate in a Commission
6	meeting by video conference from any
7	location if such Commissioner is unable
8	to attend the meeting in person due to
9	extraordinary circumstances, which
10	include, but are not limited, to
11	disability, illness, caregiving
12	responsibilities, or any other
13	significant or unexpected event.
14	And, three, members of the public
15	may view Commission meetings by video
16	and may attend, and where public comment
17	is authorized, may participate in
18	Commission meetings in person, by video
19	conference, or by any other remote means
20	established by the Commission.
21	And, finally, the procedures for
22	remote participation and attendance by
23	the Commission and members of the public
24	shall be posted on the Commission's
25	website.

1 Do any of the Commissioners have any 2 questions or comments regarding the 3 second proposed resolution? 4 (No response.) MR. FELDMAN: The Commission will 5 now vote as to whether to adopt this 6 7 resolution. 8 If the Commission votes "yes", the 9 resolution will be adopted. If the Commission votes "no", the resolution 10 11 will not be adopted. 12 Is there a motion from the 13 Commissioners to adopt the resolution? 14 MS. STRAUBER: Move to adopt. 15 MR. FELDMAN: Thank you, 16 Commissioner Strauber. 17 And is there a second? MS. CROTTY: I'll second. 18 19 MR. FELDMAN: Thank you, Chair 20 Crotty. 21 I will be calling on each 2.2 Commissioner and designee to collect 23 votes. 24 Commissioner Crotty? 25 MS. CROTTY: Yes.

MR. FELDMAN: Commissioner Strauber? 1 MS. STRAUBER: Yes. 2 3 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Chief of Staff Baret? 4 5 MS. BARET: Yes. MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Commissioner 6 7 Anderson? 8 MR. ANDERSON: Yes. 9 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy General Counsel Rozen? 10 MS. ROZEN: Yes. 11 12 MR. FELDMAN: And Inspector Hyland? 13 MR. HYLAND: Yes. MR. FELDMAN: Let the record reflect 14 15 that the vote is unanimous. 16 The resolution will note each 17 Commissioner and designee's vote today. The Commission will now consider a 18 19 Registration Application, which the Commission staff has recommended be 20 21 denied. 22 Trac Construction Group, Inc. 23 submitted an original application for an 24 exemption from the Commissioner's trade 25 waste licensing requirement to operate

1	as a trade waste business solely engaged
2	in the removal of waste materials
3	resulting from building demolition,
4	construction, alteration, and
5	excavation, also known as a Class 2
6	registration.
7	The Applicant was served with a
8	notice of the grounds to recommend the
9	denial of its application. The
10	Applicant was advised that it had 10
11	business days to submit a sworn written
12	response to the Commission. The
13	Commission did not receive a response
14	from the Applicant.
15	On June 9, 2023 we emailed
16	Commission members the recommended
17	denial decision regarding the
18	Application at issue. There have been
19	no material changes made to the
20	recommended denial decision since then.
21	The Commission staff has recommended
22	denial of the Application of Trac
23	Construction Group, Inc. based on the
24	following grounds, as fully set forth in
25	the staff's recommendation:

1 One, the Applicant failed --2 knowingly failed to provide information to the Commission. 3 And, two, the Applicant and its only 4 5 disclosed principal, Anna Olivieri, provided the Commission with false and 6 7 misleading information on the Application. 8 9 Do any of the Commissioners or 10 designees have any questions or comments regarding this recommended denial? 11 12 (No response.) MR. FELDMAN: The Commission will 13 now consider the recommendation. 14 15 The Commission members will vote 16 whether or not to adopt the staff's 17 recommendation to deny the Application. A vote of "yes" is a vote to adopt 18 the staff's denial recommendation. A 19 20 vote of "no" is a vote not to adopt the 21 recommendation. 2.2 Is there a motion from the 23 Commissioners or designees to adopt the 24 staff's recommendation? 25 MS. STRAUBER: Move to adopt.

STRAUBER: Yes. MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Chief of Staff 14 15 Baret? 16 MS. BARET: Yes. 17 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy Commissioner Anderson? 18 MR. ANDERSON: Yes. 19 20 MR. FELDMAN: Deputy General Counsel 21 Rozen? 22 MS. ROZEN: Yes. 23 MR. FELDMAN: Inspector Hyland? 24 MR. HYLAND: Yes. 25 MR. FELDMAN: Let the record reflect

1	that the vote is unanimous.
2	That concludes the matters before
3	the Commission. Thank you to the

5	participation and to the members of the
6	Commission staff for their hard work on
7	these matters.
