ED Egan read out loud the existing fifteen conditions and a proposal to vote on a two-month variance renewal, instead of the requested six-months. Dr. Cohen read out loud one additional proposed condition to the variance. See this portion of the video recording here.

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on Dr. Cohen's proposed condition and the proposal to renew the variance for two months, instead of six months. The Board unanimously approved the proposed condition and two-month variance renewal, 8-0 (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman).

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the existing fifteen conditions. The Board unanimously approved the existing conditions, 8-0 (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman).

Lastly, Chair Jones Austin called for a motion to vote on the two-month variance with conditions. After the item was moved and seconded, the Board unanimously approved the variance with conditions, 8-0 (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman).

► Board Vote on Variance

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the variance renewal modifications requested by the Department. The Board unanimously voted against approving the Department's modifications to the YA-ESH variance, with eight votes in opposition (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman).

The Board proceeded with considering the existing variance renewal. Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the proposal to renew the variance for three months, instead of six months. The Board unanimously approved renewing the variance for three months, 8-0 (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman).

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the proposed condition to eliminate the use of shackling by April 15, 2021. The Board approved the proposed condition with seven votes in favor (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman) and one vote in opposition (Member Perrino).

ED Egan read out loud the existing eighteen conditions to the variance. Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote, and the Board approved the existing conditions with seven votes in favor (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Safyer, and Sherman) and one vote in opposition (Member Regan).

Lastly, Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the three-month variance with the existing and proposed conditions. The Board approved the variance with conditions, with six votes in favor (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards, and Members Franco, Perrino, Safyer, and Sherman) and two vote in opposition (Members Cohen and Regan).

Perrino, Safyer, and Sherman), one vote in opposition (Member Regan), and one abstention (Member Cohen).

Lastly, Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the three-month variance with the existing and proposed conditions. The Board approved the variance with conditions with six votes in favor (Chair Jones Austin, Vice-Chair Richards, and Members Franco, Perrino, Safyer, and Sherman) and two votes in opposition (Members Cohen and Regan).

Chair Jones Austin called for a motion and conducted a roll call vote on the variance with conditions. The variance failed to pass with seven votes in opposition (Chair Jones Austin and Members Cohen, Franco, Perrino, Regan, Safyer, and Sherman), and one vote in favor (Vice-Chair Richards).
