Dear Mr. Cephas:

The New York City Department of Correction (“Department”) is requesting an emergency variance pursuant to §1-15(b)(3) of the New York City Board of Correction’s (“Board”) minimum standards from sections: 1-03 Personal Hygiene, 1-05 Lock-in, 1-06 Recreation, 1-07 Religion, 1-08(f) Access to Courts and Legal Services (regarding access to the law library only), and 1-09 Visiting of the Board’s minimum standards for the Brooklyn Detention Complex (BKDC). We are seeking this emergency variance for a period of five (5) days, effective immediately, to ensure that the safety and security of BKDC is maintained and that all staff and inmates are kept safe.

Multiple slashing incidents, one on each of the following two (2) consecutive days this week, Monday, March 20, 2017 and Tuesday, March 21, 2017 at BKDC, the recovery of numerous weapons and escalating inmate tension necessitated the Department to institute a facility-wide lockdown to conduct a comprehensive assessment and evaluation of the situation including a review of the inmate population dynamics within BKDC, thorough searches and intelligence investigations. The facility-wide lockdown commenced on March 22, 2017 with the deployment of the Special Operations Division. During the lockdown, all facility supervising staff will be provided with supervisory response training. The Department has made and will continue to make every effort to limit the scope of the lockdown and any disruption to services. During the lockdown, medical and mental health services will be maintained. Best efforts will be made to afford all inmates with showers and phone calls, however, security issues may cause some disruption. While visiting will be suspended, attorney visits will remain in effect.

Despite our best efforts, we are unable to achieve full compliance with the above noted provisions of the minimum standards for the duration of the facility-wide lockdown period, in order to effectively identify, evaluate, and neutralize all threats and maintain the safety and security of the facility. On the morning of Monday, March 27, the situation will be assessed to determine whether additional time is required to continue the investigation. The Department will notify the Board immediately if the variance can be ended early or if it needs to be extended.
