Chairman Joseph Russo began the meeting at 7:15 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SECTION:

- 1. E. Fontanez: Concerns on Pelham Parkway South and Burr removal of three on-street spaces. Mr. Fontanez wants the spaces returned. On Burr Avenue no standing sign is not being respected. Police enforcement is needed.
- 2. E. Sementilli: Concerns about St. Theresa Feast. Discussed the Chairperson's policy on public speaking. Made mention of the Bus Redesign Plan about how Pelham Bay has an opportunity to suggest concerns and make comments to improve congestion in the area.
- 3. L. Rocco: Discussed Pearly Gates Park and its history. Pearly Gates Parks has improved and has held agencies accountable. Pearly Gates Park was opened late and wants the Park closed at dusk so that things do not turn for worse. Expressed concerns about a melee in Pelham Bay area with regard to St. Theresa Feast.
- 4. L. Vasquez NYPL: Spoke of events at Throggs Neck Library. Events can be found on website. Throggs Neck Library construction is finished.
- 5. J. Doyle: Discussed water quality of Eastchester Bay. Mount Vernon is being sued by the United States Government for dumping in Eastchester Bay. Asks that Community Board remain proactive on resiliency matters throughout all of waterfront communities. December 10 from 6 PM to 10PM at Grace Episcopal Church for a naloxone event.
- 6. L. Nye: There is a second 5K run on City Island. Proceeds are being donated to a family in need. It is on Thanksgiving morning at the start of the pavilion on Orchard Beach.
- 7. A. Torres: Shared event regarding Christmas gifts. Ms. Torres was able to obtain space at Throggs Neck Community Church to hold gifts. December 14 is a wrapping party to assist with wrapping gifts. It is at 2730 Bruckner Blvd. at noon. The email is ourbronxcommunity@gmail.com.
- 8. M. Joyce State Senator Biaggi: Announced new address to office. There will be an event at the City Island Library with regard to fighting the opioid crisis. It is November 25 from 6PM to 8PM. Budget form is planned for January for the entire Bronx State Senate Delegation.
- 9. E. Pryor: Announced that Council Member Gjonaj's office holds free legal services on December 11. On Tuesday, November 26 at 2401 White Plains Road there will be an Albanian Independence event. Every Wednesday the office provides senior assistance and social services.
- 10. L. Tulton: Assembly Member Benedetto: Thanked the public for attending the annual Halloween Parade. Announced that office will be closed on Thanksgiving Day and the following day.
- 11. M. Torrado State Senator Sepulveda: Announced office's information and how the office is willing to help residents of the Bronx and not just constituents. Also announced that Senator Sepulveda is Chair of Criminal Justice Committee.

- 12. M. De La Cruz City Comptroller's Office: Announced a report that was released on minorityowned businesses. There needs to be fairness in awarding city contracts. Mentioned various reports the Comptroller has commissioned.
- 13. M. Santiago Bronx District Attorney: Mentioned mock trial competition on December 10. The informational meeting will take place on December 4.
- 14. D. Cruz Congress Member AOC: Thanked the public for attending the Town Hall. Mentioned pieces of legislation Congress Member Ocasio-Ortiz is championing. The office has joined the Queens Quiet Skies Committee.

A motion to close the Public Participation Session was made by J. Russo, seconded by L. Popovic, and unanimously approved by all.

DISTRICT MANAGER'S REPORT: Mr. Cruz

The District Manager discussed topics regarding Pelham Bay infrastructure. There are upcoming sewer and transportation studies that will affect the Wilkinson Avenue area. Mr. Cruz reminded Board Members of their obligations to complete sexual harassment training. Mr. Cruz reminded Board Members and the public of a December 11 Municipal Services Committee to resolve outstanding matters. Mr. Cruz announced the opening of HEAP where he and office staff will assist constituents on how to apply for the state benefit and apply it to their heating costs.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Mr. Russo

The Committee met on November 18, 2019. The minutes are self-explanatory. Mr. Russo communicated to membership that complaints against the Board were closed by the Borough President's office. Mr. Russo remined members of the importance of parliamentary procedure. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE: Mr. Accomando

The Committee met on November 13, 2019. Ms. Baez spoke of the Bus Redesign Plan. Many members submitted ideas and suggestions. Ms. Baez mentioned the upcoming projects that will be discussed in the January and February 2020 meetings.

PARKS/RECREATION COMMITTEE: Mr. Franklin

The Committee met on November 14, 2019. The minutes are self-explanatory. City Council Member Gjonaj was the guest speaker. Mr. Gjonaj announced that evening that the package of legislation regarding Hart Island passed. Mr. Gjonaj voted no on all proposals. Hart Island is now under the control of the Parks Department.
