Board #10 Staff: Matt Cruz, District Manager

Chairman Joseph Russo began the meeting at 7:15 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence in memory of Anthony Ribustello, a former Board member who recently passed. Mr. Russo noted that Peter Sullivan resigned from the Board effective today and recognized his efforts as a member and chairperson.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SECTION:

1. R. Press: wanted updates on foil requests.

- 2. E. Sementilli, PBCIS: discussed St. Theresa Feast and the negative effect on the community as well as questioning the NYPD support of the event. He asked the Board to vote down the permit application.
- 3. L. Velazquez, Branch Manager, Throgs Neck Library: English conversation classes, Monday 10-12; tutoring 1/21 3-6 pm; census representatives will be at library; hiring for tutoring program; go to https://nypl.org/events for additional information or contact Ms. Velazquez at leidavelazquez@nypl.org

- 5. Laura Nye, resident of City Island raised concerns about the number of storefront vacancies on the island, recquested the economic committee to look into it.

A motion to close the Public Participation Session was made by Mr. Salimbene, seconded by Ms. Baez, and unanimously approved by all.

A motion to accept the minutes from the November 21, 2019 Bronx Community Board #10 meeting was made by Salimbene, seconded by Mr. Chirico, and unanimously approved by all.

DISTRICT MANAGER'S REPORT: Mr. Cruz

District Manager discussed the following items:

- 500 Baychester Avenue; wind turbine collapsed, no injuries, damage to nearby vehicle; the two monopoles will be removed and the NYC Department of Buildings has revoked all permits
- Transit District 12 which covers the IRT #6 train will receive more police on the system both on the trains and platforms with undercover officers and uniformed officers
- On or about Feb. 14 in the Board office, CB #10 will partner with DSNY to distribute reusable grocery bags
- The public hearing concerning the entrance to the Throggs Neck Bridge has been postponed pending comments from local civic associations
- Foil policy the Board will be charging \$.25 per document copy for all future requests, if taken off site. Viewing may be done after hours with the individual who initiated the FOIL request.
- Liquor licenses that applied for renewal in 2018 are reapplying this year; renewals are every two years.
- Board Member A. Torres is collecting pencils for the School District 8 Give the Kid a Pencil Campaign. Donations may be dropped off at the Community Board Office.
- On January 27, 2020, 6:30 p.m-9:00 p.m. at Metropolitan Community College, 463 E. 149th Street, 2nd floor, 10455 the NYC Department of City Planning is holding a workshop on zoning, ULURP and environmental review for board members. Bronx District Attorney Darcel Clark discussed the new criminal justice reform laws. She will be visiting communities to inform them of the laws and the compliance issues the criminal justice agencies are now facing. She urged the community to reach out to the state elected officials with concerns. In a nutshell, bail reform removes bail for misdemeanors and non-violent felony cases; discovery now necessitates evidence and witness information to be provided within fifteen days and speedy trials are now connected to discovery. She noted that the discovery is a daunting task for her staff and is working diligently to adhere to the fifteen days. Going forward, she expects that there will be discussions to tweak the reform laws with elected officials. On January 21, 2020 at 6:00 p.m., 851 Grand Concourse, there will be a Town Hall on these reforms.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Mr. Russo

The Committee will meet on Tuesday, January 21, 2020. Mr. Russo reminded the committee chairpersons that March is the month in which chairperson elections must take place. He noted that all work done by the Board originates at the committee level.

HOUSING/ZONING COMMITTEE: Mr. Popovic

The Committee met on January 6, 2020. The minutes are self-explanatory. Mr. Popovic asked for a correction to the meeting minutes to amend the date to January 6, 2020.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE: Mr. Accomando

The Committee met on January 7, 2020. The minutes are self-explanatory. There was a resolution for renewal liquor licenses.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES COMMITTEE: Ms. Baez for Ms. Velazquez

A motion to separate the two street activity requests was made by Mr. Bieder, seconded by Mr. Russo which was unanimous.

Annual Feast of St. Theresa was discussed among Board members. Mr. Cruz noted that the applicant has filed for the necessary permits pertaining to insurance and gambling. Board members felt that in previous years, disruptive individuals have caused havoc in the surrounding area as well as causing property damage. Many noted the issues are lack of police presence, violence and negative effect on residents who live within the street closures. It was also noted that no representative from the Church attended the Board meeting. Mr. Cruz said that the Board's vote is only advisory and the event may still be approved by the NYC Street Activity Permit Office.

Brian Polanco, Bronx Borough Advocate of Pubic Advocate's Office: newly established unit; 212-669-7250 <u>gethelp@advocate.nyc.gov</u>; check social media on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Mr. Polanco discussed projects such as more frequent inspections of catch basins and parking placard abuse.

Ishrael Gonzalez, Office of Bronx Borough Diaz, Jr.: Mr. Gonzalez reminded the Board members that they must complete sexual harassment training. New board applications are available in each community board office as well as on the Borough President's website. Board member term limits are now in effect. Naureen Ahkter, Office of Congress Person Ocasio-Cortez: urged the community to contact the office, located at 1973 Westchester Avenue for assistance with any federal issue. Ms. Ahkter added that the selection process for the military service academy has been completed and encourages all resident to complete the Census.

NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer addressed the audience. He discussed the unspent FEMA monies being held by New York City and concerns for the over 500 ft of shoreline within the NYC. Ashley Meza, Office of Senator J. Bailey; The Senator is working alongside CB 10 and Assemblyman Benedetto in creating a bill to prevent wind turbines and monopoles within 1500 feet of any building. Contact the Senator's Office for constituent services.

Mirian Torrado, Office of Senator L. Sepulveda: Sentor is drafting legislation for affordable housing and voting reform.

Leon Tulton, Office of Assemblyman M. Benedetto: Mr. Tulton mentioned the bail reform laws which took effect recently; 16 and 17 year olds can now pre-register to vote at age 18; good Samaritan law to protect those that assist in the administering of medication for opioids; new laws – bail reform, 16-17 can preregister to vote; opioid epidemic – medication for treatment good Samaritan law for those that assist in administering medication for opioid; municipal buyback program through NYS Police

Maribel Martinez, Office of Council Member Andy King: Ms. Martinez introduced herself as a new staff member. She said the Council Membe is very concerned with the collapse of the windturbine at Baychester Avenue. There will be a town meeting on January 29, 2020 at the Bartow Mall with the local elected and NY City agencies concerning the issue.

Board member Mr. Bieder asked Ms. Martinez about funding for the Beacon Program for Truman High School and asked to speak with a representative.

Farrah Rubin, Office of Council Mark Gjonaj: Ms. Rubin announced that the Bronx bus redesign – no changes to the express bus service; tax preparation 2x a week, rsvp; metro card movile van; job fair 1/30 at Bronx house

Miguel Rondon, Office of Senator A. Biaggi: The Senator's office has alternate side parking available; the Office is also at Bronx House every Wednesday 10-3; and at Community Board #10 every 3rd Tuesday of each month from 11-4; 2nd Annual Bronx delegation on budget priorities to be held at Lehman College on January 30, 2020.
