

#### May 2019 District Manager's Report

At the April Leadership Committee meeting, I got complaints/inquiries about the following situation at 2225 Lodovick Avenue:



As stated last month, this is a temporary boiler, which has been on the street at this location for over a year. According to the Easco Boiler Corporation, this is not uncommon. The funding required to fix the permanent boiler tends to be an issue. I reached out to the Community Action for Human Services, the owner of the property, which claimed they're waiting on an inspection by the City Department of Buildings (DOB), which I also reached out to and which informed me of the following violation, which has a court hearing currently set for May 31:

And then after the Office contacted the City DOT (Department of Transportation) about this, we got the following email from DOT:

Upon inspection, our inspectors observed Easco Boiler Corp with a mobile boiler place in the parking lane in front of 2225 Lodovick Ave without a valid DOT Permit.

I recommend CB11 goes with the current proposal, which would be in accordance with the full board vote last month.

Board Member Bernadette Ferrera and I met with News12 yesterday to talk to a reporter about a property on White Plains Road adjacent to Amtrak rail lines. According to CityMap, the property is owned by Amtrak, although Bernadette and I suspected a private developer cut down the trees and is looking to build on the property.

On May 23, Chris received a call from a man who owns most of the properties in this area on Baker Avenue, claiming that he owns the property in question. Chris advised him to contact his lawyer. The property owner claims that he has already been in consultation with Council Member Torres/Torres's Office about potential rezoning.

For those of you who have tickets for Bronx Community Board 11 at Yankee Stadium, you are probably already aware that last week's game has been rescheduled for Monday, August 12 at 1:05 p.m. This will not be the same game where the Yankee Award recipients will be honored. The award recipients will be honored with an on-field ceremony at the Monday, June 24 game against the Toronto Blue Jays. That game starts at 7:05 p.m., but award recipients need to enter Gate 2 no later than 6:15 p.m. I will be the point of contact for the recipients that day.

On May 15, I got the following complaint: The parents and faculty at St Francis are being harassed by ticket agents.

I spoke to the PD (Police Department) about this. The PD said it doesn't have any real control over traffic agents. If anything, they have more control in telling traffic enforcement where there is a problem that needs to be addressed. So, I informed 49 Community Affairs that a different complainant stopped by the CB11 Office and:

complained about the need for traffic cops at St. Clare's at Hone and Rhinelander Avenues. The need for traffic cops is 8-8:15am as well as 2:45-3pm. Anyway, you can assist in getting agents there?

Previously, the Principal at P.S. 108 also requested some type of enforcement at his school.

It was requested that I create/rectify a 311 log, which I've enclosed in board members's packets and which is a work in progress.


