  - a. Stephen Caruso, NYC Department of Sanitation, spoke about fall leaf collections and composting opportunities
  - b. Robert Press, CB11 constituent, spoke about the Parks Department proposal, budget priorities, and other items
  - c. Just Home Initiative at Jacobi Medical Center speakers
    - i. Patti Marinello, CB11 constituent, spoke about the Fortune Society Just Home Project and that there was no data on their track record.

    - vi. Diana Finch, CB11 constituent, said the board should not vote tonight because there is missing information and the review process as well as her Ethics Committee complaint has not been addressed
