III. Follow-up from previous month

a) Bronx Animal Shelter – The City Council has approved the Bartow Avenue site for a new state of the art animal shelter despite stiff opposition from some residents of near-by Co-op City. In addition to providing much needed shelter space for homeless and abandoned animals, it will bring employment, educational and volunteer opportunities to Bronx residents.

IV. New Business

- a) Status of DSNY Curbside Organics Program In the absence of DSNY Organics Outreach staff, the Chair provided an update on the program.
 - 1. DSNY opened up the program to Bronx residents in February 2018. Through the service, food waste, food-soiled paper and yard waste is collected from residents and turned into useful products such as compost or renewable energy.
 - 2. The DSNY has halted expansion of the program that was scheduled to serve all New Yorkers by the end of 2018.
 - 3. This will not affect any of the residents currently served with organic recycling collection.
 - 4. Only 10% of the organic waste produced by the current participants in the program is getting collected. The other 90% is not being sorted which means it ends up in landfills along with regular trash.
