- I) Public Session began at 6:30 pm

- 1) If you do not file income taxes but you earned more than \$3000.00 through pension, social security, and disability, you are still entitled to a stimulus rebate package. You have until 10/15/2008 to file to get your check. Contact WBH at 718-798-0929 for an appointment.
- 2) Starting in May, CB7 will host a joint program to assist people with housing issues (except finding new housing). These issues include eviction prevention, SCRIE, DRIE, Section 8 recertification (only), and tenant/landlord mediation. Homeowners can come in for assistance with water or tax lien issues, clearing housing violations (HPD), and foreclosure counseling.
