# GENERAL BOARD MEETING MINUTES Tuesday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2009 @ 6:30PM

Meeting held at: Botanical Garden ♦ Bronx, New York 10458

- I) Public Session opened at 6:40 pm:
  - A) Robert Newell Organizer for the union Local 1500: supports the Fresh Program's standards to provide healthy foods
  - B) Mr. X: Expressed concerns regarding the rise in tolls
  - C) Mr. Kelvin Ramirez Department of Transportation employee & CB7 Resident, Complained about the blocking of streets (East 197<sup>th</sup> Street & Pond Place) by playing in the streets outside his building. He claims basketball games go on outside his home 24 hours a day. He is at his wits end and needs relief from the constant noise
  - D) Marsha Newman 3520 Tryon Avenue: Protesting noise, drugs, blocking driveways, general nuisance and lock of sleep. She claims the police cannot solve the problem, and requests assistance from the Community Board.
    - 1) Sallie Caldwell offered advice to attend the precinct council meeting this week.
    - 2) Carlos Cortez expressed his dismay and concern about the problems of lawlessness in the community around Father Zeiser Place where he lives
  - E) Anthony Rivieccio Community Resident: Expressed concerns regarding the barbecuing along Mosholu Parkway which is against the law. He also noted the lack of signs regarding the prohibition of barbecuing.
    - a) Councilman Oliver Koppell promised his support and follow-up on this issue
  - F) Michael Pimentel Former CB7 Member: Talked about the drugs, loud music, noise in the neighborhood and urges a better quality of life
  - G) Hector Velazquez 3436 Gates Place Resident: Concerns about drug dealing in the neighborhood and the danger of reporting concerns to the 52<sup>nd</sup> Precinct. He wants to see more police on foot patrol
    - Gregory Faulkner moved the agenda to address the quality of life issues and asked PO Wilson Hernandez to address the audience regarding these issues

  - b) Councilman Oliver Koppell verbally expressed his concern and his offer to have residents call him with their complaints

  - A) Kingsbridge Armory and upcoming ULURP was addressed. The Community Benefits Agreement was discussed and the need to have a satisfactory agreement in place
  - B) On July 14<sup>th</sup>, the 4 resolutions on the Armory will be voted on at the Special Community Board Meeting
  - C) A Public Hearing regarding the Armory will be held on June 24<sup>th</sup> at Lehman College's Faculty Dining Room

  - A) 3 New Board members
- V) Councilman Oliver Koppell's Report:
  - A) He remarked on the high number of applicants to the Community Board
  - B) He spoke of the budget that was passed on last night:
    - 1) Community Board's budget was restored
    - 2) Libraries open 6-days per week
    - 3) Cultural institutions' budget restored
    - 4) Fire Houses to remain open
    - 5) Geriatris and children's budgets restored
    - 6) 100 child-care workers jobs restored
    - 7) New school on Wester Avenue
    - 8) National Guard to move out of the Armory to make room for a school to be built there

  - A) Parks & Recreation by Barbara Stronczer:
    - 1) Motion to send a letter to Hector Aponte requesting the placing of "No Barbecuing" signs along Mosholu Parkway and in Devoe Park

  - 1) Motion from the Executive Committee to deny 3 Licenses was passed unanimously
    - a) Denial of License for Harlequin Inc. located at 2769 Webster Avenue
    - b) Denial of License for Tequila Song located at 3856 Webster Avenue
    - c) Denial of Liquor License for Los Girasoles Restaurant located at 2613 Webster Avenue
  - 2) Motion to approve a Liquor License for Sal's Restaurant located at 3167 Bainbridge Avenue was passed unanimously
  - VIP Lounge on Gun Hill Road had been approved previously due to a long history of good management
- D) Sanitation & Environmental by Helene Hartman-Kutnowsky:
  - Ms. Lowell Green expressed concerns about the techniques used around the water-shed that could contaminate our water supply. A discussion ensued with Mr. Koppell offering personal knowledge of the dangers of use of such techniques
