- I) Opening Statements by Paul Foster:
 - A) Paul asked for a minute to reflect on the Boston massacre victims
- II) Public Session:
 - A) Lowell Green, Board Member:
 - 1) Spoke about the River Plaza complex, as well as Target's proposal for installing a storage building on the site. A public hearing about a change in zoning to approve the project will be held
 - 2) Villa Avenue became a one-way street going north
 - 3) Ms. Green reported on the Concourse project that is in construction
 - 4) Williamsbridge Oval pedestrian safety improvement at a meeting on Wednesday at MMCC with DOT on Wednesday 4/17 from 6:30pm to 8:30pm
 - B) Kwasi, Community Resident:
 - 1) Concerned about the condition of Parks in the Community, especially the trees and he would like to see more green areas
 - C) Dilletta Pina, Board Member:
 - 1) Announced Health Information Forum to take place on Wednesday, April 24, 2013 at St. James Park
 - 2) The next Health and Hospitals Committee meeting will take place on 5/20/12 at 6:00pm
 - D) Victor Vazguez, Puerto Rican Day Parade Rep:
 - 1) Parade will take place on June 2nd at 1pm. The parade will start at 192nd Street and Grand Concourse
 - E) Zelnor Myrie, Chair of the Neighborhood Advisory Group 7 (NAB) 7:
 - Talked about federal grants that benefit the community and the responsibility of the Community Board to get the word out about the priorities. Surveys are due on June 28th
 - 2) The amount to be awarded is \$360,000. The needs of the community is paramount
 - 3) Public Hearing to be held on June 15th will discuss how to obtain funding. The Public Hearing will be held at the Bedford Park Senior Center
 - F) Walter Bell, Board Member:
 - 1) Announced that on June 16th, women over 40 without health insurance are eligible for a free Mammography

- G) Inspector Joseph Dowling, 52nd Pct:
 - 1) Crimes are up during the last 3 weeks (14%). 3 shootings during this time have been reported
 - 2) 4/4, there was a Federal take down on Narcotic (194th Street and Briggs Avenue)
 - 3) Some assaults in the Parks; Grand Larceny is also up
 - 4) Questions about security in NYC after the Boston Massacre were raised and discussed at length
 - 5) Comp-Stats were available for distribution
- H) William Smith, Congressman Charles Rangel's Office:
 - 1) Announced that the congressman will hold a tenant meeting on Monday 4/22 at 6:00pm at Tracey Towers, all are welcome
- I) Timothy Tapia, Councilman Cabrera's Rep:
 - 1) Reported on the Crime Mapping Bill that Councilman Cabrera will introduce
 - 2) FREE Big Apple Tickets are available from the Councilman for local schools
- J) Natalia Fernandez, Assemblyman Mark Gjonaj's Office:
 - 1) The Assemblyman will be at M.S.80 on May 1st regarding a Graffiti initiative
 - 2) "Take Back the Night" will be held on 4/24/13 at Lehman College at 5:00pm
 - 3) They are looking for a satellite office in the community
- K) George Diaz, Councilman Oliver Koppell's Office:
 - 1) There will be an "Access-A-Ride" workshop on May 14th
 - Spoke about "ENCORE! A JAZZ REVIVAL" to be held on 4/28 at the Woodlawn Cemetery from 1-4pm
 - 3) Discussed the "FREE Quit Smoking Program", An 8-session program to help people quit smoking is starting on April 29, 2013 in the 1st Floor Conference Room at Montefiore Medical Park, 1695 Eastchester Road from 5:30 7:00 p.m.
