GENERAL COMMUNITY BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, October 21, 2014 @ 6:30 PM

Held at: Serviam Gardens ♦ 321 East 198th Street ♦ Bronx, NY 10458

- I. Public Session began at 6:30 pm with the following speakers:
 - A. Congressman Charles Rangel's Office by Lauren Loftin:
 - 1. The Congressman supports the President's actions on making Colleges more aware of Sexual Assaults
 - 2. He is a supporter of October being Breast Cancer Awareness Month. No information available on when there will be an office located in the Bronx. The office number is 212-663-3900
 - B. Assemblyman Jeffrey Dinowitz:
 - 1. The Labor and Delivery Unit has re-opened at North Central Bronx Hospital
 - 2. 25 miles- per -hour has now become the default speed limit for NYC
 - 3. Election Day is Tuesday November 4, 2014. There are 3 ballot initiatives on the back of the ballot. Asked all present to vote
 - C. Dilletta Pina CB7 member:
 - 1. Announced a Halloween event on October 31, 2014 at the Williamsbridge Oval Recreation Center at 7:00 pm
 - D. Candido De Leon:
 - 1. Is planning to take over a Billiard Hall located at 2301 Jerome Avenue. This location has been a Billiard Hall for 10 years. Would like a letter of support from the CB. Matter referred to Economic Development Committee
 - E. Inspector Hoffman of the 52nd Precinct:
 - 1. Announced that burglaries were up in the Bedford Park area. A professional burglar was hitting commercial areas
 - 2. The State Liquor Authority as of today has shut down the Xtreme Lounge located on Valentine Avenue where a number of serious incidents have accrued.
 - 3. At 204th and Valentine Avenue outside the Community Board Office, shots were fired. There will be increased patrols and a portable light tower put on the site. Police are investigating the reason for the shots being fired
 - 4. Shot Spotter will be coming to the precinct
 - 5. On November 7, 2014, the new 25 miles-per-hour speed limit for NYC goes into the effect
 - 6. On November 20, 2014, the Precinct's Community Council will be meeting at Scott Towers
 - 7. She announced that cars are being stolen around the Oval area
 - 8. There is a new scam were individuals are requesting deposits on apartment that they do not have rights to. Please use licensed real estate agents only
 - 9. CB7 honored Inspector Hoffman with an award for leadership in the community

- H. Parks and Recreation by Barbara Stronczer:
 - 1. The Parks Department removed 30 benches on Mosholu Parkway. Questions on if benches were in bad shape. Parks Department did not inform anyone of their action. A letter requesting better communications will be sent. Not sure when benches will be replaced.
 - 2. Oliver Place:
 - i. The Parks Department does not want the responsibility to create and maintain this space as a park
 - 3. MOTION: (Presented and Seconded):
 - i. "CB7 will send a letter to DOT requesting that the fence around Oliver Place be repaired. Also the letter will ask if DOT will lease the land to a neighborhood organization or group to maintain" - (MOTION passed)
 - 4. The committee will work on a letter to the Parks Department stating that the Parks Department cannot deprive the children of CB7 of play space
- I. Public Safety & Quality of Life by John Snider:
 - 1. The "Time Warp" event at the Kingsbridge Armory was not given a permit and will not happen. There were concerns about safety
 - 2. Simulated Fire-Arm Training will take place in December
 - 3. At the November 6, 2014 meeting the Bronx District Attorney Office will be present
 - 4. All were asked to attend the 52nd Precinct Community Council Meeting
