Public Session

- 1. Debra Oguamah, Founder/CEO Creating Unity in the Community, Inc.
 - Ms. Oguamah is requesting community support in getting a plaque or memorial for the only independent African Burial Site in the Bronx, located next to St. Helena Church at 1315 Olmstead Ave. and on the site of Chang Li Supermarket 2079 Benedict Ave. and Unionport Road Bronx, NY 10462. In 1849, a group of black men formed the first African American church in the Bronx and, alongside it the only independent African burial ground known to have existed in the borough. Ms. Oguamah and her organization wants to bring attention to commemorate this sacred site and honor their beloved Ancestors so that their stories are never forgotten. She is requesting help with organizing a dignified memorial by signing the petition below and sharing your name and contact, more information can be found at these links:

- 2. Odette Wilkens of Wired Broadband and Theodora Scarato, Environmental Health Trust re: Link5G Cell Towers represent non-profit teams focusing on safe technology for the public, they recommend that community boards either ask for an extension of time if possible, as the comment period has expired, or vote for disapproval and a moratorium on the planning and construction of Link5G Cell Towers until questions and concerns are addressed. White Paper and presentation included numerous arguments against these tower/kiosk installations. As per Ms. Wilkens, 7 towers have been sited for District 9 with 2,000 kiosks sited citywide but this number can eventually go up to 4,000 or 7,500.

In addition, in relation to the previous speaker's request for support around the African Burial Site, 10 historical societies are on record opposing the installation in historic districts and that number is increasing. Furthermore, the FCC has ignored current scientific data related to damages resulting from Link5G Cell Towers installation, insurers rank 5G non ionizing radiation that comes from the towers as high risk, and that's why companies actually can't get insurance for damages, the International Association of Firefighters has officially opposed cell towers on their stations until research shows that the radiation is not hazardous to the health of their members. Kiosks are 32 feet in height, about 3 stories high and there are no set back restrictions, therefore towers can be placed close to resident windows and structures which poses a potential danger because polls can have structural failures. As per Ms. Wilkens, service will not be interrupted if 5G cell towers are not installed. Other negative consequences include decrease in property values of 20% or more and HUD has not been assigning mortgages within the fall zone of a tower. As per Ms. Scarato, the FCC was found to have ignored science on the record related to memory damage, children's vulnerability, DNA, damage, headaches, fertility, impacts, and a lot of other health effects related to RF radiation aka radio frequency radiation. In addition, insurers rank 5G non ionizing radiation that comes from the towers as high risk, and that's why companies actually can't get insurance for damages from exposure.

1. Senator Jose M. Serrano, Legislations include:

Serrano Bill S 259: Requires Cultural Awareness and competence training for medical professionals. – PASSED

Serrano Bill S.724: This legislation will prohibit the lease of state forests, wildlife management areas, and unique areas for the purpose of gas production. – PASSED

Seranno Bill S. 1458: To create a legislative task force on outdoor environmental education and recreation passes the NYS Senate. – PASSED

Senator Serrano held an Arts rally - On March 22nd, he joined colleagues and arts advocates from across the state at a rally in Albany supporting increased arts funding in the NY State budget. The arts and culture are vital to every corner of New York State. They provide countless benefits to our society, while serving as a major economic engine for our communities.

2. Senator Nathalia Fernandez, Legislative Updates:

The State Senator along with every state elected official are in Albany working to finalize the budget. Hopefully the budget can be passed this week, but there are no guarantees. - 4. Bronx Borough President Vanessa Gibson, The Office received over 540 applicationsnew and reappointments. The office is currently interviewing applicants as well as members applying for reappointment.
 - Borough President Gibson joined the BOEDC to announce their board of director nominations.
 - Black Maternal Health Week: This week we bring special attention to the health disparities that disproportionately affect Black women and birthing individuals across our city, state and nation. Borough President Gibson hosts bronx "My Sister's Keeper" initiative in partnership with Bronx school districts.

- 5. Congress Member Alexandra Ocasio Cortez, 1. They have opened their Hunts Point office at the Banknote building. It is located at 1231 Lafayette Ave, Suite L-610, Bronx, NY 10474. They are open Monday through Thursdays from 9-5pm. They are also open at their Co-op City office located at 177 Dreiser Loop, RM 3, Bronx, NY 10475 on Mondays and Tuesdays. On Fridays, they are available by phone at 718-662-5970 or online. 2. For many years, some community members have wanted to Cap the Cross Bronx: placing a cover over the Cross Bronx Expressway to make it easier to walk across and to reduce asthma and other illnesses that come from car pollution.
