I. Introduction

A. Committee Description: The Parks and Recreation Committee represents the community's interests with regard to parks, park services and all park related matters and acts as a liaison between parks users and the New York City Parks Department.

II. Speakers

A. Joel Grassi & Derrick Holman, Skatepark Project

As per Ms. Barnes, the area next to the track in Soundview Park was previously identified about 10 years ago as a plausible site for this.

As per Mr. Grassi, the Tony Hawk Foundation wants to have a meeting with all Soundview Park stakeholders to discuss the feasibility of this park housing the skate park

As per Ms. Barnes, it may be helpful to loop in Kips Bay for suggestions as they have an ice skating rink in the district

As per Mr. Grassi it is important for the skate park to be world class and not a park skaters don't want to visit.

C. Victoria Toro, Bronx River Alliance

The Bronx River Alliance serves as a coordinated voice for the river and works in harmonious partnership to protect, improve and restore the Bronx River corridor so that it can be a healthy ecological, recreational, educational and economic resource for the communities through which the river flows.

The Starlight Park Phase II converted 2.7 acres of formerly paved, industrial property into a beautiful greenspace with added greenway connections for New Yorkers to enjoy. It officially opened last month with \$41 million in renovations.
