# A. District 8, PS 36x The Rising Stars School - Principal Quyen Quach

The school serves 730 students in Grades PreK to 5. P.S. 36 is committed to creating a safe, nurturing environment in which learning and teaching are exciting. They provide each student with a diverse education that promotes independence, creativity, and excellence in learning. They believe that when educators, parents, and students collaborate, students achieve personal and academic success. P.S. 36 offers students extracurricular activities including: Rising Stars Basketball Team, Computer Science Club, Student Council, Art Club, Green Team, and Chorus in addition to other programs such as LEAP Arts Residency, BioBus, Erik the Reptile Guy, Scaramouches Puppets, Bronx Academy of Arts and Dance, Paul Simon Residency, Minecraft Battle, Girls in STEAM, Bullseye Math Competition, and Zerowaste Projects.
