Sharon Neill is a dedicated public administrator with over 20 years of experience in financial management, budgeting, and administrative services in government and higher education. She is currently a Deputy Commissioner for the New York City Department of Buildings (DOB) responsible for the Agency's operating and revenue budgets of \$327 million, asset management, and human resources.

Ms. Neill began her career working in construction management as a project manager where she performed a wide range of duties including: project management, cost estimating, project budgeting, and regulatory compliance studies. This work provided her with a practical knowledge of governmental regulations, real estate, project management, and budgets.

She transitioned into public service at the New York City Office of Management and Budget (OMB) as a capital budget analyst and moved up the ranks to become the Assistant Budget Director of the Administrative Agencies and Elected Officials Task Force. Ms. Neill directed the task force in the preparation, administration and oversight of \$1.3 billion in operating funds and \$200 million in annual capital commitment funds for over thirty Administrative Agencies and Elected Officials.

Prior to her post at OMB, Ms. Neill served as the Assistant Vice President of Budget and Finance for the City University of New York Hunter College. In that position, Ms. Neill supported the college's financial planning and resource allocation by planning and administering over \$200 million in operating funds. In addition, she oversaw the administrative and support services of Accounting, Accounts Payable, Budget and Planning, Bursar, Office Services, Payroll, and Purchasing.

Deputy Commissioner Neill earned her Master of Public Administration from City University of New York John Jay College, and her Bachelor of Science degree from the State University of New York College at Buffalo.
