

UPCOMING CHANGE

Cranes + Derricks: New Mast Climber Forms

Beginning July 1, applicants must use the new Mast Climber application forms and submit them to the Department's Cranes and Derricks Division before installing, climbing, using or removing a mast climber.

MC1 Mast Climber Prototype Application

For mast climber whose make and model is not yet approved for use in New York City, the mast climber's manufacturer must submit the MC1 form. The application should include supporting documents, such as manuals, capacity charts and design certifications.

MC2 Mast Climber Device Application

Mast climber owners must submit the MC2 form for approval or re-registration of an individual mast climber. The MC2 should be submitted with supporting documentation, which **must** include a list of the mast's critical components, the owner's certification and a disclosure of the mast climber's history. *Owners must re-submit this application each time the mast climber is to be used in New York City.*

MC3 Installer and Remover Form

The mast climber owner must submit the MC3 form to designate the party responsible for installing or removing a mast climber at a job site.

MC4 Mast Climber Notification

The NYS-licensed engineer who prepared the mast-climber plans must submit the MC4 with the plans to notify the Department that a mast climber will be used.

MC5 Certificate of On-Site Inspection

The NYS-licensed engineer who prepared the mast-climber plans must submit the MC5 to sign off on a mast climber to be used in New York City. This application **must** be submitted with supporting documents and photos that demonstrate that the mast climber has passed all prior inspections before use.
