NYPD's Proposed Changes to the Disciplinary Matrix

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Introduction

• NYPD established its Disciplinary Guidelines in January 2021.

Commonly referred to as the "Matrix."

• They are designed to be updated periodically by the NYPD.

Purpose of the Matrix

1.Establish uniformity of penalties.

2. Inform the members of service of the consequences of misconduct and violation of the NYPD Patrol Guide.

3. Show transparency of discipline of the members of service to the community that it serves.

NYPD/CCRB Memorandum of Understanding

- CCRB entered into a Matrix Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") on February 14, 2021.
- In that agreement, CCRB and NYPD agreed to use the penalty guidelines set forth in the Matrix for its recommendations and only deviate from the Matrix in extraordinary circumstances.
- On May 18, 2023, NYPD announced proposed changes to the Matrix.
