MOCJ develops and implements strategies, with partners inside and outside government, to reduce crime and incarceration and to promote fairness and legitimacy.

Job description: MOCJ seeks a Chief Research Officer who is motivated, curious and entrepreneurial, possesses strong interpersonal skills and thrives in a fast-paced environment. The candidate must have strong managerial, operational and analytic skills in order to:

- Develop the office's research agenda, manage multiple projects and ensure that the substantial support allocated for research is wisely invested.
- Develop an evaluation agenda for the City's criminal justice programs, including recruiting outside evaluators.
- Manage a staff of 10 researchers and develop a cross-agency learning cooperative.
- Lead a citywide data integration effort that includes building analytic systems and tools across multiple agencies and other entities to guide criminal justice policy making and operations.

Requirements:

- PhD, MA, or equivalent graduate degree in criminal justice, public policy, public health, social science (including but not limited to economics, sociology, psychology, or political science) or related field.
- Experience with relevant research methodologies and a demonstrated interest in criminal justice.
- Management experience, including the ability to work across multiple disciplines.
