File your taxes safely and for free at a **special one-day event** at **Coney Island Seaside Innovative Senior Center**, hosted by Council Member Mark Treyger in partnership with the NYC Department of Consumer Affairs and RGC VITA. At this pop-up NYC Free Tax Prep site, an IRS certified VITA/TCE volunteer preparer will help you get the full refund you deserve.

**To qualify for this free service, you must earn \$54,000 or less (with children) or \$30,000 or less (no children).**

## TAX DOCUMENTS TO BRING TO SITE:

- Photo ID (such as a driver's license, IDNYC, or passport)
- Social Security card or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) card or letter for you, your spouse, and your dependents
- Birth dates for you, your spouse, and your dependents
- Income statements or forms, including:
  - Form W-2 (wages from each job)
  - Form 1099-INT (interest)
  - Form 1099-DIV (dividends)
  - Form 1099-R (retirement plans)
  - Form W-2G (gambling winnings)
  - Form 1099-G (unemployment)
  - Form SSA-1099 (Social Security benefits)
  - Form 1099-MISC (miscellaneous income)
  - Form 1099-B (sale of stock)
  - Form 1098-T (scholarships and grants)
  - Form 1099-C (Cancellation of Debt)
- Your 2014 tax return (if available)
- Verification of health insurance for each person listed on the return (Forms 1095-A, 1095-B, or 1095-C) or Health Insurance Exemption Certificate (if applicable)
- Form 1098-T (tuition payments to attend a university or technical college)
- Form 1098-E (interest paid on student loans)
- Documentation of child care payments for your children. Bring provider's name, address, and Taxpayer Identification Number or Social Security number.
- Records of cash and non-cash charitable contributions
- Checking and/or savings account and routing numbers for direct deposit of your refund

*If filing a joint return, both spouses must be present to sign required forms.*
