Job Description

The NYC Department of Homeless Services seeks an Associate Staff Analyst to serve as a Program Analyst in the Adults Services Division. The Program Analyst will oversee the social services that not-for-profit providers perform for the Department of Homeless Services (DHS). S/he will assist in developing Requests for Proposals (RFP's); provide social services technical assistance to the DHS Agency Chief Contracting Officer and read/rate proposals that are submitted. S/he will work with providers to establish short-term/long-term operational staffing goals; conduct operational reviews, workforce planning analyses, and routine/special site visits to ensure that all agency requirements and applicable City, State and Federal laws, rules and regulations are met. The Program Analyst will also analyze/review/approve operating budgets and financial plans and will participate in the design and implementation of performance measurement standards. S/he will also conduct reviews of client case histories, independent living skills, and exit interviews, ensuring that the documentation meets all agency requirements; and assist providers in designing strategies to motivate difficult clients. In addition, s/he may also represent the agency during community meetings and/or discussions with local officials and community leaders.

A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university, accredited by regional, national, professional or specialized agencies recognized as accrediting bodies by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) and three years of satisfactory full-time professional experience in the areas described in "1" above.
