

## CHAPTER 11 CONSERVATION OF WATER

### §11-01 Definitions.

**Board.** "Board" means the Board of Health of the New York City Department of Health.

**Commissioner.** "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Health of the New York City Department of Health.

**Department.** "Department" means the New York City Department of Health.

**Permit.** "Permit" means a written license and authorization issued by the Board or Commissioner to carry on specified activities as regulated by the New York City Administrative Code or the New York City Health Code, and includes certificates of approval as well as certificates of qualification.

**Permittee.** "Permittee" means a person who holds, or is required to hold, a valid permit issued by the Board or Commissioner pursuant to the New York City Administrative Code or the New York City Health Code.

**Person.** "Person" means an individual or partnership, corporation, firm, joint stock association or any other group of individuals who carry on an activity regulated by the Department.

### §11-02 Order.

All permittees shall take the following measures, where applicable:

- (a) Water is not to be served other than upon a specific request of a customer, and then served only to the extent requested;
- (b) All water leaks, drippings, seepages, or other loss of water, due to whatever cause, are to be immediately corrected or repaired;
- (c) Water shall not be allowed to flow unless in actual and immediate use in the conduct of the permittee's business or activity, and then only to the extent necessary therefor as may be determined by the Department;
- (d) Permittees shall comply with all Department rules and regulations concerning water use, conservation and curtailments, including any specific directions that may be given to a permittee by Department personnel.

### §11-03 Penalties.

- (a) Failure to comply with these regulations shall be a violation of §3.07 of the New York City Health Code and may subject the permittee to a fine of up to \$500.00 for each violation as provided in §3.12 of said Health Code.
- (b) Continued or repeated waste of water, or failure to adhere to Department rules, regulations or directions may result in an order to discontinue operations until the permittee is in compliance with these regulations.
