

Make a Safe Bris for Your Baby

When a baby is circumcised, some ritual Jewish circumcisers (mohelim) do a practice called metzitzah b'peh. After metzitzah b'peh, some babies can get sick with herpes, which can even lead to death.

- Talk with your baby's doctor about metzitzah b'peh.
- Before you hire the mohel for the bris, ask if he does metzitzah b'peh. If you



do not want metzitzah b'peh, tell the mohel you do not want it.

 If a mohel did perform metzitzah b'peh during your baby's circumcision, watch his skin for little bumps or blisters, especially on or around your baby's genitals and buttocks.
