

Also, thanks to the efforts of Kathy Dawkins, Public Information, 250 cuddly DSNY "Billy Bears" were delivered to young children from New Orleans who were evacuated to San Antonio, Texas, where they are now enrolled in elementary schools. Supervisor Chris Abbate, Manhattan CFC, spent several weeks as a volunteer with the American Red Cross tending to the needs of hurricane victims in Louisiana. Emerald Society President Thomas J. Doyle and his colleagues in Lot Cleaning collected and shipped hundreds of backpacks filled with school supplies to children in the Gulf Coast who lost everything in the storms (see photo.) Scott Rosenbaum, Operations Management Division, served as a team leader for New York Cares' Emergency Response Team, where he

supervised 25 volunteers, and **Debra Barreto**, **Community Affairs**, and **Majita Dalton**, **OMD**, also volunteered a week of their own time to help out. And **Doug Luback**, **Supervisor of Mechanics** (**BME**) and a Lt. Commander in the Naval Reserves, was dispatched to Mississippi to provide technical expertise in the massive debris removal operation.


