#### Why Reuse?

Extending the useful life of items through reuse keeps materials out of the waste stream and conserves the energy and resources required to produce new items.

- Recycle what remains

#### **Impact**

In 2013, ReuseNYC members diverted over 16.6 million pounds of items from NYC's waste stream! These items include everything from clothing to construction materials, office supplies, furniture, books, electronics, household goods, and more.

About: Build It Green!NYC (BIG!NYC) is New York City's only nonprofit retail outlet for salvaged and surplus building materials with a mission to keep these materials out of the landfill. They run two reuse centers in NYC, and are open seven days a week for shopping and dropping off donations, BIG!NYC reduces the amount of unnecessary construction and demolition (C&D) waste clogging the landfills, contributing to pollution, GHG emissions, and climate change.

FBR operates a retail store, prop shop, and creative reuse center in Gowanus, Brooklyn. Over 60% of donated materials are redistributed to FBR's network of 15+ nonprofit partners in NYC.

#### **Materials for the Arts**



**About:** Materials for the Arts is the creative reuse program of the NYC Department of Cultural Affairs. They collect a wide variety of reusable supplies from businesses and individuals, and then make these materials available for free to over 4,500 nonprofit organizations with arts programming, city agencies, and public schools.

Accepted Donations: art books; art supplies; canvas; chairs; clip lamps; computers & peripherals (less than 4 years old); digital cameras & tripods; drop cloths; easels; fabric rolls; file cabinets; foam-core; home decorating supplies; household items (dishes, lamps, irons, silverware, and vases); ladders; office supplies; paper; poster-board; power tools; projectors & screens; rolls of fabric; stretcher bars; theater lighting; TVs (flat screen only); video equipment; wallpaper



**About:** New York Cares brings volunteer support to more than 850 nonprofit agencies, public schools, and other deserving organizations throughout the five boroughs of New York City. New York Cares works with each organization to identify their pressing needs, creates projects where volunteers can make a meaningful difference, and then recruits and deploys teams of volunteers to help meet those needs.

Along with this, New York Cares also runs the City's largest coat drive annually, from November through February, which collects gently used winter coats from caring New Yorkers and distributes them to children, women, and men at homeless shelters, community organizations, and agencies serving seniors.

#### **NYC WasteMatch**



**About:** NYC WasteMatch is an online exchange which facilitates the donation or sale of used and surplus goods from organizations that no longer need them to those that do. NYC WasteMatch matches generators of valuable commercial "waste" and surplus with nonprofit and forprofit organizations in need of no-cost or cheap materials.

NYC WasteMatch clients reduce disposal or purchasing costs, and in some instances obtain tax-deductions, all while decreasing their environmental impact. Clients include New York City businesses, nonprofit organizations, and government agencies.

NYC WasteMatch is a program of NYC Center for Materials Reuse and funded by NYC Department of Sanitation, Bureau of Waste Prevention, Reuse and Recycling.

NYC WasteMatch Helps Exchange: (NYC WasteMatch does not physically accept materials. NYC WasteMatch in an online exchange, helping match those with secondhand/surplus items with those in need.) building materials; cardboard; computers; containers & packaging; electronics; furniture; glass; medical equipment & supplies; metals; office & art supplies; office equipment; paper; plastics; surplus food; textiles

#### **Project Cicero**



**About:** Project Cicero is an annual nonprofit book drive designed to create and supplement classroom libraries in under-resourced New York City public schools.

Since its inception in 2001, Project Cicero has distributed over 2.2 million new and gently used books to more than 11,000 New York City classrooms and school libraries, reaching over 500,000 students. They receive donations from more than 100 independent, public, and parochial schools each year, and also receive generous contributions from many publishers.

Early readers through high school fiction and all nonfiction (including reference books, biographies, science, and math), both hardcover and paperback. Picture books are also welcome. #### Recycle-A-Bicycle



**About:** Recycle-A-Bicycle (RAB) is a community-based bike shop that facilitates job training and environmental education. Through innovative programs such as Earn-A-Bike, Green Jobs Training Programs, High School Internships, Recycled Arts Workshops, Summer Youth Employment Program, and Kids Ride Club, RAB is dedicated to the health, development, stewardship, and empowerment of NYC youth.

On average, RAB salvages 1,800 bicycles each year from the waste stream, diverting a total of 45,000 pounds of waste from NYC's landfills. Every purchase from their storefronts directly supports their youth programs and environmental initiatives.

Parents visit Room to Grow's warm and inviting space once every three months from just before the birth of the baby until their child turns three. During visits, parents receive developmental information, customized support, and all of the needed baby items to ensure a healthy and secure start for their child.
