| About Health and Medical: Health and Medical is one of the four units with the Planning and Preparedness Division at NYCEM, which supports the overall agency mission by coordinating with other agencies to plan the City's response to emergency incidents. The mission of the Health and Medical Unit is to support the resiliency of New York City's medical infrastructure through emergency event planning, information sharing and partnership building. Health and Medical works closely with health departments, healthcare facilities, emergency medical services and, in addition to several other City and State agencies, and local non-profit organizations. During emergencies, these partners support the City's response activities in the Emergency Operations Center. | |
| Description of Project/Intern Responsibilities: The intern will work with members of the Health and Medical Unit on citywide CBRNE planning, specifically biological incident planning. This will include supporting the Health and Medical Unit with writing and organizing sections of citywide plans, including public health response planning and other CBRNE plans as needed. In addition, the intern will be responsible for assisting the Health and Medical Unit with public health surveillance reporting and drafting protocols with Watch Command as needed. | |
