





Significant Events

- December 1st: Metro North Train Derailment
- December 5th: Graduation of most diverse class of probationary firefighters in FDNY history
- December 30th: Online tracking of end-to-end emergency 911 response time reporting every segment of a 911 call from when the initial call is placed to the first arrival on scene
- January 5th: Death at 3rd Alarm fire in Midtown brings attention to fireproof, high-rise safety
- March 18th: Racial Discrimination lawsuit with Vulcan Society settled
- June 6th: Commissioner Daniel A. Nigro sworn-in as the Department's 33rd Fire Commissioner
- June 29th: Commissioner Nigro joins members marching in the Heritage of Pride Parade
