The HOPE Program (\$304,930) was founded in 1984 and provides workforce development services to approximately 300 low-income New Yorkers each year with significant barriers to employment, including homelessness, histories of criminal justice involvement and substance abuse, low educational attainment, and poor work history.

Safe Horizon (\$530,000) began in 1975, when the Vera Institute of Justice launched a pilot program in response to the urgent need to assist witnesses who felt too threatened to testify in NYC's criminal courts. In 1978, pilot program became the Victim Services Agency (renamed Safe Horizon in 2000), offering a broader array of services to help an increasing number of survivors of various victimizations. Safe Horizon offers a comprehensive array of programs, touching the lives of more than 250,000 individuals affected by violence each year.

Sheltering Arms Children & Family Services (\$322,537) provides services to over 5,000 low-income individuals annually. Sheltering Arms currently operates eleven Early Childhood Education Centers, nine afterschool programs, a Community School program, programming in foster care/group home facilities, juvenile justice placement and aftercare, and services for developmentally disabled adults.
