


# The Graduation Rate Increased to An All Time High of 66 Percent

In 2005, 22% of students dropped out. Since then, 54,690 fewer students dropped out than would have if that rate stayed the same.

### Percentage of Dropouts in 4 Years




# Even As Diploma Standards Increase, More Students Are Earning Regents Diplomas



**% of Graduates Meeting College Readiness Index**




**% of Cohort Meeting College Readiness Index**

# Since 2005, 4-Year Graduation Rates Have Increased For All Ethnicities


Asian Students


Black Students


Hispanic Students

White Students



# Since 2005, 4-Year Graduation Rates for English Language Learners and Students with Disabilities Have Increased


## English Language Learners

# 4-Year Graduation Rates for Black and Hispanic Males Have Increased Dramatically Since 2005

The overall black and Hispanic graduation rates increased 3.6% and 2.1%, respectively, from 2012 to 2013
