**ONE NEW YORK: WORKING FOR OUR NEIGHBORHOODS  
FREE HIGH-SPEED BROADBAND FOR NYCHA RESIDENTS**

In July 2015, Mayor de Blasio announced a first-of-its kind investment in bringing free, high-speed broadband service to more than 16,000 New Yorkers living in five public housing developments in Queens, Brooklyn and the Bronx. With those projects underway, the Mayor is now looking to expand NYCHA broadband to include two new public housing complexes in Manhattan and Staten Island.

**Details**

- The Mayor is expanding NYCHA broadband to eventually provide high-speed internet access to nearly 6,000 residents of the Jefferson Houses in Manhattan and the Stapleton Houses on Staten Island.
- Together with Queensbridge South and North Houses, the Red Hook West and East Houses, and the Mott Haven Houses, access to free NYCHA broadband will be available to almost 22,000 New Yorkers.
- Broadband service is scheduled to begin at the Queensbridge, Red Hook and Mott Haven developments before the end of 2016, with full coverage in 2017. Service will begin at the Jefferson and Stapleton developments in 2017.
