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INTRODUCTION

The District Resource Statement (DRS) is prepared annually by the Office of Management and Budget. Sections 2707 and 2708 of the New York City Charter require that agencies report to the City's 59 community boards expense budget and service information at the agency's service district level. The reporting levels vary by agency and by program. Service districts range from police precincts which can be smaller than community districts to multi-borough offices.

This edition of the DRS gives information for both FY 2012 and FY 2013. The current edition reports on agencies that deliver services directly to community districts and boroughs. These agencies manually generate the information in the DRS, except for the fiscal data which is provided by the Financial Information Services Agency. The agencies also provide performance indicators for a variety of services. An explanation of agency programs and performance indicators is included.

Personnel headcounts and corresponding fiscal data, equipment information, performance indicators, and contractual services are organized as follows:

- **Personnel Report** - FY 2012 headcounts and fiscal data are as of June 30, 2012. FY 2013 Adopted Budget data is as of the Budget Adoption in June.
- **Equipment Report** - Unless otherwise noted, FY 2012 information is as of June 30, 2012. FY 2013 information indicates proposed equipment levels.
- **Performance Report** - Once again, community boards will be able to compare select measures of agency

performance within their district to a borough-wide and/or citywide average of the agency's performance. Except where indicated, the performance figures are full year figures for FY 2012. Section 12(c)6 of the New York City Charter states that "for agencies with local service districts or programs within community districts and boroughs, the mayor's preliminary management report and management report insofar as practicable shall include schedules of agency service goals, performance measures and actual performance relative to goals for each such local service district or program." Indicator information in the DRS supplements the Mayor's Management Report by providing measures of performance at the local level. Totals for all the districts reporting in the DRS will be consistent with the citywide numbers reported in the MMR except where otherwise noted.

- **Contract Report** - Data on contractual services varies somewhat from program to program, but includes at least the time period of the contract, the cost of the contract, the kind of service provided and some measure of the service.

For each agency program, all pages for a particular local service district are grouped together in the following order: Personnel, Equipment, Performance, and Contract Reports. The Personnel Reports give a complete description of the service and the address of the local service district headquarters. The contract pages provide the names and addresses of vendors, and sometimes the location where the service is provided.

The District Resource Statement is useful to the community boards at all stages of the budget participation process. Community boards can use the DRS to monitor service delivery throughout the year. It provides a common data base which the agencies and community boards can use to discuss service delivery and to formulate specific budget requests. The Performance Reports can help the boards assess the quality of the service in relation to the resources which are deployed in or budgeted for the community district. By comparing this year's DRS with previous editions, community boards can also use the DRS to analyze trends in funding levels, resource allocation, and service delivery. Using the Mayor's Management Report, boards are able to compare service performance indicators in their district with citywide findings.

Caution must be used in interpreting the information contained in this document. Agencies often need to move personnel or equipment from one district to another or employ seasonal workers depending on the time of the year. These changes are not reflected in the DRS. A reduction in staffing levels does not necessarily signal a corresponding reduction in services. Where necessary agencies provide explanatory footnotes. Also, Financial Plan Savings are not reflected in the local district reports because these amounts are budgeted at the Unit of Appropriation level. It is not possible to predict the impact of financial savings on an individual service district level.

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HUMAN RESOURCES ADMINISTRATION

AGENCY MISSION

The New York City Human Resources Administration/ Department of Social Services (HRA/DSS) provides temporary help to individuals and families with social service and economic needs to assist them in reaching self-sufficiency. By providing essential work supports such as food stamps and public health insurance, former cash assistance recipients have a greater ability to stay employed and out of poverty.

HRA serves more than 3 million New Yorkers through essential and diverse programs and services intended to provide work supports, services to custodial parents and necessary and appropriate support services for eligible vulnerable, frail and/or disabled residents. These include: temporary cash assistance, public health insurance, food stamps, home care for the elderly and the disabled, child care, adult protective services, services for victims of domestic violence, home energy and utility assistance, HIV/AIDS support services and child support enforcement, assistance and fraud and identity theft assistance.

Agency Overview

HRA offers a diverse range of services through Family Independence Administration, Medical Insurance and Community Services Administration, HIV/AIDS Services Administration, Customized Assistance Services, Emergency and Intervention Services, Office of Citywide Health Insurance Access, Office of Child Support, and Investigation, Revenue and Enforcement Administration.

- The number of persons receiving cash assistance increased 1.4 percent at the end of the first four months of Fiscal 2013, compared to the same time in Fiscal 2012. HRA continues its welfare reform efforts designed to engage recipients in work and work-related activities to enhance their ability to obtain employment and reach their maximum level of self-sufficiency. The December 2012 number of cash assistance recipients is the lowest number of recipients since January 1964. The number of persons receiving Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits increased slightly during the first four months of Fiscal 2013, compared to the same period in Fiscal 2012. A streamlined application process now includes telephone interviews and the ability for applications to be submitted via mail, fax and online.
- During the first four months of Fiscal 2013, the amounts collected and costs avoided because of efforts to combat Medicaid fraud, waste and abuse increased by 19.8 percent compared to the same period in Fiscal 2012. This increase is due to a more focused effort on client and provider

Medicaid prescription drug fraud investigations as well as increased efforts to recover monies owed from Supplemental Needs Trusts.

- HRA/DSS job centers offer temporary financial assistance, food stamps and Medicaid to eligible individuals. Eligible adults in receipt of financial assistance are required to participate in an employment or rehabilitative activity designed to help them achieve their highest level of self-sufficiency. In addition, they are provided with child care and transportation support.
- The job centers reflect both a philosophical commitment to self-sufficiency and a programmatic effort to emphasize the essential role of work in their lives. In the first four months of Fiscal Year 2013, HRA helped 31,932 clients obtain employment. In Calendar Year 2012, HRA achieved 86,947 job placements, exceeding its calendar year goal of helping 85,000 New Yorkers find or keep jobs, even in a difficult economy. HRA/DSS is committed to being a model social service agency that maximizes individual self-sufficiency, familial responsibility, and community involvement.

The Human Resources Administration Program Areas

The Human Resources Administration (HRA) assists individuals and families in achieving and sustaining their maximum degree of self-sufficiency. HRA provides cash assistance and employment services at 24 Job Centers, the Family Services Call Center and its satellites, and the Special Project Center. Currently, 16 of these sites are Model Offices designed to streamline workflow and enhance access to services. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits are provided at 16 home centers and two special population centers. HRA offers public health insurance at 14 Medicaid Community Model Offices. HRA provides HASA support services to medically eligible individuals at 12 centers (nine are Model Offices) and adult protective services through six HRA borough offices and six contracted programs. HRA determines the personal care eligibility of disabled or frail Medicaid recipients through seven Community Alternative Systems Agency offices and contracts with 51 vendors for service. Services to victims of domestic violence are offered at 52 State-licensed shelters, 15 community-based programs, school-based programs, and include DHS and NYCHA and Job Center based services. HRA assists New York City families in obtaining child support orders and collecting child support payments at four borough and five Family Court offices.

Customized Assistance Services (CAS)

Customized Assistance Services (CAS) is a highly specialized division that provides direct and contracted clinically oriented services as well as expertise in the areas of health, mental health, substance abuse and rehabilitation to HRA's other program components. CAS develops and oversees clinically focused programs that provide comprehensive and individualized services to assist clients with medical and/or mental health conditions to achieve their maximum degree of self-reliance. CAS has five functional units: the Office of Health & Mental Health Services, the Office of Rehabilitation Services, the Office of Clinical and Service System Integration, the Office of Administration and Program Facilitation and HIV/AIDS Services Administration (HASA).

CAS is responsible for the Wellness, Comprehensive Assessment, Rehabilitation and Employment (WeCARE) program, the Visiting Psychiatric Service, the Placement Assessment and Client Tracking Unit (PACT), the Medical Consultation Unit, and the Disability Services Program.

WeCARE helps cash assistance clients with medical and/or mental health conditions that affect employability attain the highest possible degree of function and self-sufficiency. Services include assessment, diagnosis, individualized service planning, linkages to treatment, case management, vocational rehabilitation, skills training and education, job placement and retention, and assistance in obtaining federal disability benefits.

March 2012, HASA was transferred to CAS. Presently, HASA serves 32,000 medically eligible clients, as well as nearly 12,000 non-medically eligible case members, through individualized service plans that provide the appropriate level of identified support for each case.

HASA provides intensive case management, rental assistance, emergency and non-emergency housing, and assistance with applying for public benefits and services including Medicaid, food stamps and cash assistance. HASA also provides vocational services that prepare clients for work.

Enhanced housing benefits are still being issued to HIV/AIDS Services Administration (HASA) clients well within the State mandated thirty days and the percent of HASA caseload receiving these benefits increased by 6 percentage points as of December 2012, compared to December 2011. The time to complete the review of applications for enhanced housing benefits for HASA clients decreased by 1.3 days, or 15.7 percent compared to the first six months of Fiscal 2012. The time it took to issue ongoing enhanced housing benefits to eligible clients decreased by 3 days, or 18 percent. This improved performance is due to a new automated housing benefit application review and issuance process. The new process has resulted in better documentation and increased accountability at all levels of review and supervision.

Emergency and Intervention Services

Emergency and Intervention Services is made up of several social service programs including Adult Protective Services (APS), Office of Domestic Violence, Emergency Food and Nutrition Assistance Program, and the Office of Emergency Services.

Adult Protective Services (APS) intervenes monthly on behalf of approximately 9,000 mentally and/or physically impaired individuals who need protection from themselves or others due to neglect, abuse, or financial exploitation, when there is no one else to responsibly assist them. Typical APS services include referral for psychiatric or medical examinations and ongoing care, assistance in obtaining entitlements such as Medicaid and SSI, heavy duty cleaning services, rental arrears assistance to prevent evictions, and financial management to ensure that future rent is paid on time. APS investigates allegations of abuse, neglect and financial exploitation, and is required by law to file a report with the NYC Police Department when it has reason to believe that a crime has been committed against a person whose eligibility for APS services is currently being assessed, or for an adult who has been determined to be in need of APS services.

The Office of Domestic Violence provides social services for victims of domestic violence including community-based counseling and advocacy as well as emergency shelter. ODVEIS directly operates one emergency domestic violence shelter, administers 45 state-licensed emergency residential programs and oversees private customer referrals for seven transitional housing programs. In the shelters, clients receive a full complement of services to support their transition into safety and stability. All programs provide a safe environment as well as counseling, legal assistance, services for children, advocacy and referral services.

The Emergency Food and Nutrition Assistance Program is comprised of the Emergency Food Assistance Program, which is a network of 500 food pantries and soup kitchens citywide, and the Office of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Outreach Services, which conducts community outreach for SNAP.

Office of Emergency Services includes Crisis and Disaster Services, which responds to citywide emergencies such as hurricanes, snow storms and blackouts; the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), the Heatline, which is the homebound HEAP unit, Utility Assistance Program, and the Department of Environmental Protection safety net program all of which provide energy related services to low income households.

Family Independence Administration (FIA)

The Family Independence Administration (FIA) operates HRA's Job Centers and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Centers, administering temporary cash assistance, employment services, and medical assistance for those receiving cash assistance. FIA works to help clients reach their maximum level of self-sufficiency and overcome any barriers to employment. Through directly operated and contracted services, these programs are designed to promote the maximum possible level of self-reliance through work and personal responsibility.

HRA/DSS Job Center staff brings resources to people to help them move toward self-sufficiency. Eligible individuals are enrolled in comprehensive employment programs which include work experience, job search and placement services, as well as vocational, job skills training and educational programs. As clients work to achieve their personal self-sufficiency goals, FIA's staff provides these eligible able-bodied New Yorkers and their families with the food assistance to which they are entitled. SNAP benefits are also provided to the unemployed, elderly and the disabled. Job Center staff is also responsible for determining ongoing eligibility for cash assistance.

Over the past year, FIA's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) has introduced a number of initiatives designed to increase access to the food stamp program. The initiatives allow working applicants in certain circumstances to have their eligibility interview over the telephone. All recipients who do not need to come to the office for a specific purpose, such as, finger imaging, are eligible for a telephone recertification interview. HRA has also partnered with a number of community-based organizations to provide for the electronic submission of SNAP benefit applications and the supporting documents from community-based sites.

Medical Insurance and Community Services Administration (MICSA)

MICSA links New Yorkers to public health insurance programs while also administering the Agency's medically-related social services Home Care Services Program.

Currently, there are more than 2.3 million New Yorkers enrolled in public health insurance programs that are not receiving cash assistance. Enrollment remains high through the continued efforts of HRA/DSS and community partners, managed care plans and health care providers who work directly with potentially eligible New Yorkers to facilitate the completion of public health insurance applications or submit them on their behalf and to renew their coverage.

For New Yorkers who require long term support to live independently, HRA/DSS provides home

care and long term care for the elderly and disabled.

MICSA includes:

Medical Assistance Programs (MAP): MAP makes eligibility determinations for public health insurance programs that pay for medical services for low income New Yorkers who qualify. MAP directly administers these benefits for persons who do not receive Cash Assistance or Supplemental Security Income. MAP determines eligibility for Medicaid, Family Health Plus, Nursing Homes, Medicare Savings Program (also known as Medicare Buy-In), the Family Planning Benefit Program, Prenatal Care Assistance, Medicaid Buy-In Program for Working People with Disabilities, and other waiver programs.

Home Care Services Program (HCSP): HCSP offers a range of Medicaid-funded, non-institutional long-term care programs that enable the frail, the aged and the disabled to remain in the community. HCSP assists consumers with the initial Medicaid application and renewal of Medicaid required for these programs. Consumers have a choice of various long term care options such as the Long Term Home Health Care Program, Assisted Living Program and Personal Care.

Office of Community Affairs and Immigrant Services (OCAIS)

During 2012, the Office of Community Affairs and Immigrant Services (OCAIS) communicated with constituents through more than two million phone calls and close to 8000 letters and emails from constituents, elected officials and advocacy groups. HRA Community Coordinators regularly met with 59 community boards citywide and logged 850 community-based field visits. OCAIS staff is available to work closely with both constituents and public officials who have HRA-related inquiries.

The *Office of Refugee and Immigrant Affairs (ORIA)* is within OCAIS and was created in 2000 as a dedicated unit to maintain and expand HRA's tradition of serving Limited English Proficiency (LEP) individuals, refugees and immigrants. ORIA monitors HRA's LEP client contact points, centralizes management of translation and interpretation contracts, assists program areas in drafting and implementing policies regarding service to LEP clients, contracts for testing of prospective bilingual workers and provides training to Agency staff on utilizing interpretation services, compliance with NYC Local Law 73 and Executive Order 120, and the complexities of determining eligibility for immigrants.

ORIA has worked to improve immigrant and LEP access at all HRA offices around the city through the provision of on-site interpretation services, instant telephonic interpretation in over 180 languages, bilingual testing and written translation of key client-contact forms and notices. In FY 2012, HRA completed 732,605 customer requests for interpretation services and translated more than 2,000 documents.

To further increase the awareness of free interpretation services at HRA facilities to assist in the process of applying for and/or maintaining public benefits all, HRA sites post multi-lingual signs advising clients of the services. In addition, the majority of HRA's frontline staff participated in two language access trainings during 2012 and "I Speak" cards are provided to LEP clients through application kits and other venues in order to help LEP clients easily identify their need for an interpreter.

Office of Citywide Health Insurance Access (OCHIA)

HRA's Office of Citywide Health Insurance Access (OCHIA) works through partnerships and directly with residents and small businesses at events and through its online decision support tool, NYC Health Insurance Link, to provide information on the various health insurance options available through both public and private programs. OCHIA staff partners with community and faith-based organizations, chambers of commerce, business improvement districts (BIDs), local development corporations, local library systems and City Agencies to expand awareness of and access to public and private health insurance as well as free or lower-cost care for uninsured residents through trainings, presentations, and one-on-one assistance for individuals, freelancers, and small businesses.

To ensure that all those who are eligible for public health insurance are enrolled, OCHIA promotes and manages the collaborative work of 12 City agencies, 9 managed care plans and a wide array of community and faith-based organizations to provide outreach and facilitate enrollment in neighborhood venues such as public schools, diverse places of worship, public housing developments and community events. Known as the HealthStat Initiative, this collaboration has facilitated enrollment in public health insurance programs for 44,100 New Yorkers in FY 2012. OCHIA also makes teenagers, young adults, City agency staff, community-based and clinic partners aware of the Family Planning Benefit Program (FPBP), in an effort to reduce teenage pregnancy. (FPBP is a Medicaid expansion program that provides free and confidential family planning services for teens, women and men who are not eligible for Medicaid or Family Health Plus and meet income and other eligibility criteria.)

Also, OCHIA has initiatives to expand health insurance offerings by the City's small businesses. In 2007, OCHIA, in partnership with the Mayor's Office, successfully obtained voluntary agreements from all New York City's insurers to make domestic partner coverage available for New York City small businesses with 2-50 employees. OCHIA has also worked to promote Healthy NY, a state subsidized insurance product targeted to help low-wage uninsured workers obtain coverage and their small business employers start offering coverage for the first time.

September 2009, OCHIA launched a new website, NYC Health Insurance Link (www.nyc.gov/hilink), to help small businesses and city residents find private health insurance, including lower-cost plans like Healthy NY. It allows consumers and business owners to compare plans across all insurers operating in New York City and is designed to educate consumers and respond to the many questions they have as they look for insurance. The website also features tips for making coverage more affordable, such as pairing public and private coverage and setting up

Section 125 cafeteria plans to make insurance less costly for workers. Since its inception, the site has helped over 142,000 New Yorkers learn about their health insurance options. Starting in the fall 2010, the content of NYC Health Insurance Link was expanded to include information about federal health care reform to help New Yorkers understand the ways that it will impact their health insurance choices and options. During 2011, OCHIA created fact sheets for small business owners, immigrants and young adults to help understand their coverage and care options. To reach New York City's diverse population, the fact sheets are available in Arabic, Chinese, Haitian Creole, Korean, Russian and Spanish and can be downloaded from NYC Health Insurance Link.

Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE)

The Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) strives to improve the quality of life for children living in New York City by ensuring that they receive financial support from both parents. Child support payments from noncustodial parents (NCPs) in addition to other work supports like SNAP benefits, day care, health insurance and Earned Income Tax Credit, help families achieve and maintain self-sufficiency. OCSE assists all parents, regardless of income and immigration status. Child support services to custodial parents (CPs) and guardians include the location of NCPs, paternity establishment, summons service, establishment of child support and medical support orders, and collection, disbursement and enforcement of child support payments. CPs applying for or receiving cash assistance benefits are referred to an OCSE Borough Office for child support services and are required to comply in order to receive full benefits for their family. Parents not receiving cash assistance apply for services by visiting the OCSE office in the family court in the borough where they live. Once a child support order is established, it remains in effect until the child reaches age 21 or becomes self-supporting, unless the court orders otherwise.

In Fiscal Year 2012, OCSE collected \$748.8 million for New York City's children, an increase of 4.2%, or almost \$30 million, over FY 2011. In Calendar Year (CY) 2011, collections totaled more than \$731 million, a 4.5% increase over CY 2010. During the first seven months of fiscal 2013, OCSE collected \$407.2 million.

Since 2004, OCSE has increased its collections by 37%. Thus far in FY 2013, 93% of the funds that OCSE collects goes to families (DSS retains the remainder). Child support income can make a real difference for low-income families struggling to stay out of poverty. OCSE has implemented several programs and initiatives to help parents understand the benefits of child support, their rights and responsibilities in the formal child support process, and manage their child support cases.

Community Engagement and Outreach Services – OCSE's Division of Parent and Community Engagement has achieved significant milestones in establishing relationships with community-based organizations, faith based groups, and government agencies to increase understanding of the child support program. The goals of the division are to educate both CPs and NCPs about the benefits of child support, help CPs and NCPs navigate the child support program, and help NCPs become proactive in managing their child support cases in order to avoid accumulated child support debt. Staff provides training, workshops, and individual child support case review to programs serving parents.

Homeless Shelter Outreach – In collaboration with FIA and the Department of Homeless Services (DHS), OCSE is working to open child support cases for homeless families living in shelters and applying for cash assistance. For these families, OCSE offers child support appointments on the same day as their cash assistance interview. In FY 2012, OCSE staff interviewed 9,042 homeless cash assistance clients and forwarded 3,240 for child support court hearings.

No Kidding: Straight Talk from Teen Parents is a joint effort with the Department of Education (DOE) and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene that promotes pregnancy prevention through responsible parenting education. Peer Educators (PEs), who are teen parents, present a four session program to high school students using fun and interactive workshops highlighting the responsibilities and challenges of young parenting. The program encourages students to delay parenting until later in life, when they are more mature, better emotionally and financially prepared and in a committed relationship. The program has been steadily gaining momentum, increasing the number of peer educators and expanding beyond high schools. No Kidding continues to offer its' message to at risk youth in NYC high schools as well as the Division of Juvenile Justice Detention Centers and the Division of Youth and Community Services Summer Youth Programs. Since No Kidding started, the Peer Educators have presented to over 6,700 teens.

Employment Services – One of OCSE's goals is to connect NCPs to jobs, because without jobs, parents cannot pay the child support they owe. OCSE is committed to helping NCPs who are un- or underemployed to obtain employment so they can meet their child support obligations.

Support Through Employment Program (STEP) – Family Court Support Magistrates refer NCPs to STEP during child support hearings or NCPs may participate voluntarily. NCPs in the program will meet with an OCSE STEP worker for a referral to a vendor providing employment services. STEP is successful in collecting child support from NCPs. The total collections in FY 2012 from NCPs with a STEP history (i.e. involvement since 2002) are over \$34 million.

Employment Opportunities Program (EOP) – NCPs can receive employment services through participating HRA vendors with a referral from OCSE. In addition, OCSE provides unemployed NCPs with list of workforce one vendors.

HRA Back to Work (BTW) Employment Vendors have been recently modified to incorporate a focus on serving NCPs and providing participants with information regarding their child support case that can help avoid the accumulation of child support debt and prepare NCPs for family court. Participants are expected to fully participate in vendor workshops, job readiness, and job placement.

Debt Reduction Programs – OCSE believes that NCPs want to support their children but may be hindered by high child support debt and child support orders that are not in line with their current income. To encourage NCPs to pay child support and, as a result, take an active role in the lives of their children, OCSE developed three programs to reduce child support orders and arrears owed to the Department of Social Services (DSS). None of these programs require a court

hearing.

Modify DSS Orders (MDO) lowers child support orders payable to DSS for NCPs living at or below the NYS Self-Support Reserve (\$15,080 for 2012 for a household size of one). As of January 2013, 173 NCPs have had their average monthly orders reduced by \$281 from \$321 to \$40.

DSS Arrears Cap reduces arrears owed to DSS that NCPs accumulated while living at or below the federal poverty level (\$11,170 for 2012 for a household size of one). Through the program, OCSE can reduce arrears as low as \$500. As of January 2013, 1,314 NCPs had their total arrears reduced by more than \$14 million.

Arrears Credit Program (ACP) helps NCPs who have accumulated arrears at a time when they did not live below the Federal Poverty Level. Participants can earn a credit toward arrears owed to DSS if they remain in good standing on their current support payments. The maximum credit participants can earn is \$15,000 over three years. NCPs can enroll in the program at OCSE's Customer Service Walk-In Center. Since its initiation, 44 NCPs have signed up for ACP.

Re-Entry Initiatives

Rikers Island Initiative – OCSE has a weekly staff presence at Rikers Island to educate and provide information about child support to inmates through workshops and one-on-one counseling. Since program inception, 3,707 inmates participated in a “child support orientation,” and 1,152 received individual consultations from OCSE staff on site to discuss the rules governing child support, review their cases, and determine if they qualify for one of OCSE's debt reduction programs.

Queensboro – Queensboro Correctional Facility, a male minimum-security prison for inmates who will soon be paroled to one of the five boroughs, offers an intensive re-entry program with various classes to help inmates develop a release plan. In 2011, OCSE was asked to participate by providing Outreach Specialists to educate inmates, on-site, about their responsibility to support their children, and learn about programs that may help them better manage their child support. Since this program began, 2,110 inmates attended child support orientations and 338 requested individual consultations with OCSE Outreach Staff.

DOE Fund – OCSE continues its longstanding partnership with The Doe Fund, a New York workforce development and human services nonprofit organization providing paid transitional work, skills training, and job placement to homeless and formerly incarcerated individuals through its flagship, Ready, Willing & Able program. Since the program's inception, 313 NCP's have participated and a total of \$441,193 has been collected.

Partnership with Department of Probation (DOP) - On May 1, 2012, OCSE and the DOP completed a WEB-based Application Project that gives DOP officers, in the Bronx, access to current child support data for their probationers. This is a pilot project that is expected to be expanded city-wide. In alignment with the Mayor's Young Male Initiative, DOP Officers now have the tools

necessary to help parent's better access child support services and engage parents in a full discussion about responsible parenting. The goal of the project is to give CPs and NCPs involved with the criminal justice system better access to on-site child support information, individual consultations, and resources for jobs. By helping probationers connect to the child support program, reduce debt, avoid the accumulation of arrears in the first instance, and connect to jobs, DOP officers can aim to reduce recidivism rate and improve outcomes for children and families. Since May 2012, six DOP officers have used the application and have used 10 times the search functionality within the application.

Other Parent Services

Problem Solving Court – In an effort to improve compliance with child support, OCSE launched a Problem Solving Court pilot in Brooklyn Family Court, in partnership with the State Office of Court Administration (OCA), the nonprofit Center for Court Innovation (CCI), and FECS. This initiative connects low-income NCPs, who are in court for non-payment of child support, to employment and other services. The Problem Solving Court model utilizes the court experience as an opportunity for intervention and a positive outcome. A service plan is developed which may include job placement, education, financial counseling, legal assistance and other individualized services. All participants are held accountable through weekly compliance hearings. Success is established when an NCP has been employed and made child support payments for six months. Since its inception, there have been 166 participants enrolled in the program. The program is currently serving 77 NCPs who owe an average of \$16,425 in debt. To date, 20 participants have received order modifications and there have been 43 graduations for participants who successfully completed the program. For all participants, child support collection amounts have increased from \$52,989 (three months prior to participation) to a total of \$231,008 (since entering the program).

Cash Assistance Agreement Pilot (CAAP) - was developed in 2011 to increase compliance with child support for cash assistance families by implementing a new approach to establishing orders in a supportive, positive environment. NCPs and CPs who meet the CAAP eligibility criteria are not required to appear in court. They have the opportunity to have paternity, support and medical support established by entering into an agreement in OCSE's Customer Service Walk-In Center. By offering this service, we are testing whether this approach leads to increased compliance with child support, more court orders, and more NCPs paying their child support. Since the inception of this program, 113 agreements have been entered into from 516 NCPs who showed up at Customer Services. 86% of NCPs that keep their appointment at Customer Service get an order either there or through Family Court. This represents cases that have been completed at Customer Service or Family Court. Some cases are awaiting a final disposition in Family Court.

Mediation – By law, visitation and custody are not considered during the child support hearings. But these issues can cause resentment to grow between the CP and NCP and sometimes leads to NCPs who feel disconnected from their children and use this as a reason not to pay child support. OCSE informs parents about free and low-cost mediation services through its outreach materials and website. OCSE hopes that the mediation setting can help resolve some of these issues.

Noncustodial Parent Earned Income Tax Credit (NCP/EITC) helps reduce the amount of taxes owed, reduce child support debt owed and in many cases give money directly to NCPs. The NCP/EITC is available to low-income working NCPs who have paid 100% of the child support due for the tax year. Every year we send out letters to over 80,500 NCPs who have remained current on their orders to remind them of this opportunity. Prior to tax year 2006, the first year this credit was implemented, there was no tax break for paying child support. OCSE includes NCP/EITC information and publications in its presentations to community partners and works with the NYC Office of Consumer Affairs Office Financial Empowerment to reach out on a broader basis to noncustodial parents who may qualify for this benefit.

Mayor's Young Men's Initiative - Safety Net Cash Assistance Center - In August 2011, Mayor Michael Bloomberg announced the launch of a citywide \$43 million effort to address the disparities slowing the advancement of young black and Latino men. As a part of the Mayor's Young Men's Initiative, HRA has opened a Safety Net Cash Assistance Center that provides services to single adults. At the Center OCSE has re-deployed one staff person to provide on-site child support screenings and case reviews. The purpose is two-fold: for those NCPs we need to find to establish an order, discuss with them the importance of being a responsible father and how establishing paternity & paying child support directly benefits his/her child and emphasize the advantage of showing up to their Court hearing; for those with a child support order, it is to assist them in reducing their order or child support debt if applicable and ensuring they understand the rules of the program so as to avoid the accumulation of debt in the first place. Ensuring NCPs orders are aligned with their income and assisting them in reducing their debt directly supports their efforts to obtain and retain employment. In addition, for those who may identify issues between themselves and the mother of the child, we will refer them to mediation resources in the community. The Job Center opened in October 2012 and to date, has served more than 213 NCPs.

EXPLANATION OF INDICATORS

CENSUS DATA

The source for the 2010 Census demographic and socioeconomic data is from New York City's Department of City Planning.

PROGRAM DATA

Included for New York City, each borough and each community district is the data relating to Public Assistance, SNAP benefits, Medicaid, and SSI programs as of October 2012. The geographic breakdowns are based on address information provided by clients. *Child Support Case with Orders* and *Child Support Collected (millions)* are now included in the Program Data section. As of October 2005, the methodology for calculating the Community data has changed and should not be used to compare data from prior years.

DIRECT SERVICE OFFICES

The direct service offices operated by HRA program areas are broken down by borough and community district. Identified is the community district of their location although many of the direct service offices serve multiple community districts and/or multiple boroughs.

CONTRACT SERVICES - Planned for fiscal year 2013 (As of September 2012)

The DRS includes a list of human service contracts based on the Contractor's address. Information for these contracts includes type of service, contractual dates, contractor's name and address and contract amount. Contract addresses may not represent the areas served by the contract since the address may only be an administrative address and many contracts serve multiple community districts, as well as multiple boroughs.
