Notes from Frances Pardus-Abbadessa, Executive Deputy Commissioner HRA/OCSE:

OCSE received \$66.8 million in Child Support collections in November 2013 (a 5 week month), an increase over 3.83% compared to November 2012 (also a 5 week month). SEP is high and stable at 71.34%. PEP is at 75.93%, exceeding 75% a fourth time in a row. New Orders continue to remain high at 1,866 (representing a 25% increase for CYTD 13 vs. 12).

⁽¹⁾ This measure includes actively charging and arrears only cases. However, if we consider only actively charging cases (cases with an ongoing obligation) the Total Cases with a Collection percentage increases to 60% this month.

⁽²⁾ We continue to observe the effects of ongoing cleanup projects aiming at closing account level cases that are appropriate for closure. This contributes to the large decrease in Current Support Due and in the percentage of "Current Distributed – Former."

⁽³⁾ The State carried out a one-time clean up project in 2012 with the Department of Health to identify cases that received Medicaid at any time and moved them from Never to Former.
