Job Description	
<p>The New York City Department of Correction (DOC) is one of the largest municipal jail systems in the United States providing for the care and custody of persons accused of crimes or convicted and sentenced to one year or less of jail time. The Department manages 12 inmate facilities, 9 of which are located on Rikers Island. In addition, the Department operates two hospital Prison Wards (Bellevue and Elmhurst hospitals) and court holding facilities in each borough. During Fiscal Year 2015, the Department handled over 67,000 admissions and managed an average daily inmate population of approximately 10,240 individuals.</p> <p>Under the supervision of Deputy Executive Director of Environmental Health, the selected candidate must conduct comprehensive sanitary inspections of DOC facilities and commands. The candidate recruited will be expected to perform environmental sampling of food, air, water and various environmental toxins; perform hazmat evaluations and remediation of chemical toxins and various combustible gases; qualitative food analysis of H.A.C.C.P. and Modified Atmosphere Packaging Programs; monitoring and inspections of sanitarian programs, food processing, inmate housing and vermin control. In addition, the candidate will act as a liaison and accompany all regulatory agencies in Department of Correction facilities. Excellent written and oral communication skills required.</p>	
Minimum Qualification Requirements	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college, including or supplemented by 30 semester credits in the physical and/or biological sciences, i.e., biology, botany, chemistry, geology, physics, physiology, and zoology; of which not more than 12 credit hours may be in the applied sciences, i.e., environmental technology, sanitation technology, medical technology, public health, infection control or food service; or 2. An associate degree from an accredited college, with 15 semester credits in the physical and/or biological sciences, of which not more than 6 credit hours may be in the applied sciences, and 5 years of experience as a public health technician assisting sanitarians and engineers in carrying out the various elements of prevention and control programs affecting the public's health. 	
<p>Medical Requirement: Medical guidelines have been established for the position of Public Health Sanitarian. Candidates will be examined to determine whether they can perform the essential functions of the position of Public Health Sanitarian. Where appropriate, a reasonable accommodation will be provided for a person with a disability to enable him or her to take the examination, and /or to perform the essential functions of the job.</p>	
Residency Requirements	
<p>New York City residency is generally required within 90 days of appointment. However, City Employees in certain titles who have worked for the City for 2 continuous years may also be eligible to reside in Nassau, Suffolk, Putnam, Westchester, Rockland, or Orange County.
