

Manhattan Community Board 1 Summary

CB1 Key Facts

Major Events:

- 2001 September 11th Terrorist Attacks
- 2008 Financial Crisis
- 2012 Superstorm Sandy (October 29th)

A community built on resiliency and hard work that continues to rebuild and to develop into a 24/7 dynamic place to live, to work and to play.

- Residential population has tripled since 2000 (est. 65,000)
- Baby boom due to families wanting to move and to stay in CB1 which has compounded the shortage of school seats and ball fields
- 90+ major public and private construction projects in 1.5 square mile

CB1 Land Use Projects 2013

- 28 land use projects including single committee to multiple committee coordination (Executive, Planning, Seaport, Financial, BPC, Tribeca and Landmarks) including:
 - South Street Seaport
 - Civic Center Plan (incl. 71 Thomas Street and 66 John Street)
 - Governors Island Special Zoning District
 - Hudson River Park Act Amendment
 - East River Blueway Plan
 - Flood Rezoning Resiliency Text Amendment
 - World Trade Center Campus Security Plan
 - Citibike Implementation

CB1 Accomplishments for 2013

- 1. Created a forum to increase public participation and transparency in the public review process on multiple projects
- 2. Streamlined CB1 committee structure to consolidate review functions to increase member and public participation at meetings
- 3. Fought to create 1,000 needed new school seats for downtown youth
- 4. Advocated successfully to eliminate the kindergarten wait-list of 148 students
- 5. Advocated successfully for the rescinding of a proposal to relocate PS 150
- 6. Supported Governors Island's plan to create a new 30 acre park that will include two turf ball fields to open Spring 2014 and participated in the creation of the Special Governors Island District to encourage income-producing mixed uses
- 7. Organized CB1 Sandy recovery efforts for residents and businesses and examined impacts, including vulnerable populations
- 8. Worked with Lower Manhattan Construction Command Center to mitigate construction impacts from 90 major construction projects and extended it into 2014
- 9. Provided input to rebuilding decisions at the World Trade Center site where appropriate
- 10. Reviewed 425 applications, delivered 29 testimonies, worked on 28 land use projects and issued five special reports

CB1 Goals for 2014

- 1. Ensure that CB1 is an active partner in the planning process for all future development proposals
- 2. Ensure that neighborhood character and quality-of-life are preserved, including affordable housing
- 3. Work towards ensuring that any proposed development for the South Street Seaport maintains the area's historic character, preserves the South Street Seaport Museum, vessels and market and is in context with the existing community
- 4. Locate a site for the new K-8 school in CB1 and secure additional school seats
- 5. Minimize construction impacts from more than 90 major construction projects from the likely closing of the Lower Manhattan Construction Command Center, the central agency coordinating construction projects, due to sunset in February 2014
- 6. Increase open and active recreational space by completing the Battery Green and bikeway, two ball fields and 30 acres of park and hills at Governor's Island
- 7. Harden infrastructure and make plans to protect vulnerable populations to withstand extreme weather events
- 8. Participate in plans to complete Hudson River Park's Pier 26
- 9. Participate in efforts to open the National September 11th Memorial Museum and remove as much of the fence surrounding it and the WTC site as possible
- 10. Ensure that the WTC Campus Security Plan does not negatively affect the public realm
