C 070316 HUQ

IN THE MATTER OF an application submitted by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, pursuant to Section 505 of Article 15 of the General Municipal (Urban Renewal) Law of New York State and Section 197-c of the New York City Charter, for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area.

Borough of Queens, Community District 12.

The application for approval of the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Plan was filed by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development on February 5, 2007 as part of the Jamaica Plan, a comprehensive planning and zoning strategy for an approximately 368 block area intended to support Jamaica’s downtown business district, expand housing opportunities along the area’s major thoroughfares and preserve intact blocks in neighboring low-rise residential communities.

The following properties are proposed to be acquired:

RELATED ACTIONS

In addition to the approval of the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Plan which is the subject of this report, implementation of the proposal also requires action by the City Planning Commission on the following applications which are being considered concurrently with this application:

1. C 070158 MMQ An amendment to the City Map for the elimination, discontinuance and closing of a portion of 148th Street between 94th Avenue and Atlantic Avenue (95th Avenue)
2. C 070314(A)ZMQ Amendment of the Zoning Map
3. N 070315(A)ZRQ Amendment of the Zoning Resolution concerning Article XI, Chapter 5 (Special Downtown Jamaica District), establishing a special district and modifying related regulations
4. N 070317 HGQ Designation of the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area
5. C 070322 HDQ Disposition of property within the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Plan
6. C 070318 PPQ Disposition of one (1) city-owned property

BACKGROUND

A full background discussion and description of this project appears in the report on the related application for an amendment of the Zoning Map (C 070314 (A) ZMQ).

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (C 070316 HUQ), in conjunction with the applications for the related actions (C 070158 MMQ), (C 070314 ZMQ), (C 070314 (A) ZMQ), (N 070315 ZRQ), (N 070315 (A) ZRQ), (N 070317 HGQ), (C 070322 HDQ) and (C 070318 PPQ), was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq. and the New York City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The designated CEQR number is 05DCP081Q. The lead

agency is the City Planning Commission.

A summary of the environmental review and the Final Environmental Impact Statement appears in the report on the related application for an amendment of the Zoning Map (C 070314 (A) ZMQ).

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

This application (C 070316 HUQ), in conjunction with the applications for the related actions (C 070158 MMQ), (C 070314 ZMQ), (C 070322 HDQ) and (C 070318 PPQ), was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on February 5, 2007, and was duly referred to Community Board 12 and the Queens Borough President in accordance with Title 62 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-02(b).

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 12 held public hearings on this application on March 28, 2007, and on April 11, 2007, and on April 11, 2007 by a vote of 20 to 12 with 3 abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending disapproval of the application.

Borough President Recommendation

This application was considered by the Borough President, who issued a recommendation approving the application with conditions on May 14, 2007.

A summary of the Borough President's recommendation appears in the report on the related application for an amendment of the Zoning Map (C 070314 (A)ZMQ).

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On May 9, 2007 (Calendar No. 5), the City Planning Commission scheduled May 23, 2007, for a public hearing on this application (C 070316 HUQ). The hearing was duly held on May 23, 2007 (Calendar No. 32), in conjunction with the public hearings on the applications for the related actions.

There were a number of speakers, as described in the report on the related application for an amendment of the Zoning Map (C 070314 (A) ZMQ), and the hearing was closed.

CONSIDERATION

The Commission believes that the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area is appropriate.

A full consideration and analysis of the issues, and the reasons for approving this application, appear in the report on the related application for an amendment of the Zoning Map (C 070314 ZMQ).

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED, that having considered the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS), for which a Notice of Completion was issued on June 29, 2007, with respect to this application (CEQR NO. 05DCP081Q), the City Planning Commission finds that the requirements of Part 617 of the New York State Environmental Quality Review, have been met and that, consistent

with social, economic and other essential considerations:

1. From among the reasonable alternatives thereto, the actions to be approved are ones which minimizes or avoids adverse environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable; and
2. The adverse environmental impacts revealed in the environmental impact statement will be minimized or avoided to the maximum extent practicable by incorporating as conditions to the approval those mitigative measures that were identified as practicable.

The report of the City Planning Commission, together with the FEIS, constitutes the written statement of facts, and of social, economic and othe factors and standards, that form the basis of the decision, pursuant to Section 617.11(d) of the SEQRA regulations; and be it further

RESOLVED

The City Planning Commission finds that the proposed Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Plan is an appropriate plan for the area involved.

The City Planning Commission certifies that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area complies with provisions of Section 502, Article 15 of the General Municipal Law of New York State, conforms to the comprehensive community plan for the development of the municipality as a whole and is consistent with local objectives.

The Commission further certifies that the Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area is in conformity with the findings and designation of the Jamaica Gateway Urban

Renewal Area as adopted by the City Planning Commission on July 11, 2007. The Commission certifies its unqualified approval of the Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area, pursuant to Section 505, Article 15 of the General Municipal Law of New York State; and be it further

Resolved, by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Section 197-c of the New York City Charter, the Uniform Land Use Review Procedure, and Section 505, Article 15 of the General Municipal Law of New York State, and after due consideration of the appropriateness of this action, that the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the Jamaica Gateway Urban Renewal Area, Community District 12, Borough of Queens, submitted by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development on February 5, 2007, is approved (C 070316 HUQ).
