**IN THE MATTER OF** an application submitted by the Department of Small Business Services and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, pursuant to Section 197-c of the New York City Charter, for the disposition of city-owned property, located at 8201 Foster Avenue (Block 7920, Lots 20 and 25), in the Brooklyn Terminal Market, Borough of Brooklyn, Community District 18, pursuant to zoning.

The application (C 090376 PPK) was filed on April 6, 2009 by the Department of Small Business Services (SBS) and the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) for the disposition of city-owned property located at 8201 Foster Avenue (Block 7920, Lots 20 and 25), Community District 18, Borough of Brooklyn, pursuant to zoning.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Department of City wide Administrative Services (DCAS) and the Department of Small Business Services (DBS) is seeking the disposition of City-owned property currently occupied by the Brooklyn Terminal Market. Located at 8201 Foster Avenue (Block 7920, Lots 20 and 25) in an M1-1 zoning district, the Brooklyn Terminal Market is generally bounded by the Long Island Railroad right-of-way to the north, East 87<sup>th</sup> Street to the east, Foster Avenue to the south and East 83<sup>rd</sup> Street to the west. The area around the Brooklyn Terminal Market is generally characterized by a mix of commercial, light manufacturing and auto related uses. DCAS intends to dispose the property to the Economic Development Corporation (EDC), who then intends to dispose the property to the Brooklyn Terminal Market Merchants Association.

Established in 1942, the Brooklyn Terminal Market offers wholesale and retail produce, flowers, plants, fish, groceries, and paper goods. It is located on a 629,197 square-foot lot that is developed with nine, one- and two-story buildings which total 221,429 square feet of floor area.

The property is currently under the jurisdiction of SBS, and 31 individual companies operate their businesses from 107 spaces, or bays, under a 30-year lease that the Merchants Association signed with EDC in 2005. Following the purchase, the Merchants Association intends to upgrade the facility in order to continue the existing operations. No additional buildings are proposed to be constructed.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

This application (C 090376 PPK) was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 *et seq.* and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The lead agency is the Department of Small Business Services. This application was determined to be a Type II action which requires no further environmental review.

#### **UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW**

This application (C 090376 PPK) was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on March 22, 2010 and was duly referred to Community Board 18 and the Brooklyn Borough President in accordance with Title 62 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-02(b).

### **Community Board Public Hearing**

Community Board 18 held a public hearing on this application (C 090376 PPK) on April 21, 2010, and on that date, by a vote of 30 in favor, 0 opposed and 1 abstaining, adopted a resolution recommending approval of the application.

#### **Borough President Recommendation**

This application (C 090376 PPK) was considered by the Brooklyn Borough President, who issued a recommendation approving the application on May 26, 2010.

#### **City Planning Commission Public Hearing**

On May 26, 2010 (Calendar No. 1), the City Planning Commission scheduled June 9, 2010 for a public hearing on this application (C 090376 PPK). The hearing was duly held on June 9, 2010 (Calendar No. 12). A representative from the Economic Development Corporation spoke in favor of the application. There were no other speakers and the hearing was closed.

#### **CONSIDERATION**

The City Planning Commission believes that this application by the Department of Small Business Services and the Department of City-wide Administrative Services for the disposition of this city-owned property is appropriate.

The Brooklyn Terminal Market has been in existence at its current location since 1942, and the Brooklyn Terminal Market Merchant's Association currently holds a 30-year lease to continue to operate the facility.

The Commission believes that the disposition of this property to the Brooklyn Terminal Market Merchant's Association would facilitate its plans to upgrade the market's physical plant and enhance business operations. The Commission further believes that the sale of the property, pursuant to zoning, and its continued use as a wholesale and retail market is consistent with existing area land uses.

#### RESOLUTION

**RESOLVED,** by the City Planning Commission, pursuant to Sections 197-c of the New York City Charter that, based on the environmental determination and the consideration described in this report, the application submitted by the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, pursuant to Section 197-c of the New York City Charter, for the disposition of city-owned property located at 8201 Foster Avenue (Block 7920, Lots 20 and 25), Borough of Brooklyn, pursuant to zoning, is approved.
