IN THE MATTER OF an application submitted by the Department of City Planning pursuant to Section 201 of the New York City Charter, for an amendment of the Zoning Resolution of the City of New York, concerning Appendix F (Inclusionary Housing Designated Areas), relating to the extension of the Inclusionary Housing Program to proposed R7X and C4-5X districts in Community District 2, Borough of Queens.

The application for an amendment to the Zoning Resolution was filed by the Department of City Planning on February 8, 2011. The proposed text amendment will make the Inclusionary Housing Program applicable in R7X and C4-5X districts that are proposed to be mapped on portions of Queens Boulevard in Queens, Community District 2.

RELATED ACTIONS

In addition to the amendment of the Zoning Resolution which is the subject of this report, implementation of the proposal also requires action by the City Planning Commission on the following applications, which are being considered concurrently with this application:

BACKGROUND

A full background discussion and description of this application appears in the report on the related Zoning Map amendment application (C 110207 ZMQ).

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This application (N 110208 ZRQ), in conjunction with the related applications (C 110207 ZMQ and N 110209 ZRQ), was reviewed pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and the SEQRA regulations set forth in Volume 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations, Section 617.00 et seq. and the City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) Rules of Procedure of 1991 and Executive Order No. 91 of 1977. The designated CEQR number is 11DCP080Q. The lead agency is the City Planning Commission.

After a study of the potential environmental impact of the proposed action, a Negative Declaration was issued on February 28, 2011. The Negative Declaration included (E) designations to avoid the potential for hazardous material impacts and air quality impacts. A summary of the environmental review and the Environmental Assessment Statement appears in the report on the related Zoning Map amendment application (C 110207 ZMQ).

UNIFORM LAND USE REVIEW

On February 28, 2011 this application (N 110208 ZRQ) was certified as complete by the Department of City Planning on February 28, 2011, and was duly was referred to Queens Community Board 2 and the Queens Borough President, in conjunction with the related applications (C 110207 ZMQ and N 110209 ZRQ), in accordance with the procedures for non-ULURP matters.

Community Board Public Hearing

Community Board 2 held a public hearing on this application (N 110208 ZRQ) on March 3, 2011 and, on April 7, 2011, by a vote of 35 to 1 with 2 abstentions, adopted a resolution recommending approval of the applications.

Borough President Recommendation

This application (N 110208 ZRQ) was considered by the Queens Borough President, who issued a recommendation approving the application on May 6, 2011.

City Planning Commission Public Hearing

On May 11, 2011 (Calendar No. 4), the City Planning Commission scheduled May 25, 2011 for a public hearing on this application (C 110207 ZMQ) and the related actions (N 110208 ZRQ, N 110209). The hearing was duly held on May 25, 2011 (Calendar No. 17).

There were a number of appearances as described in the report on the related Zoning Map amendment application (C 110207 ZMQ), and the hearing was closed.

CONSIDERATION

The Commission believes that this amendment to the zoning text (N 110208 ZRQ), in conjunction with the related actions, is appropriate.

A full consideration and analysis of the issues, and the reasons for approving this application, appear in the report on the related Zoning Map amendment application (C 110207 ZMQ).

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED, that the City Planning Commission finds that the action described herein will have no significant impact on the environment; and be it further




Queens Community District 2
