Protect, preserve, and enhance resources significant to the historical, archaeological, architectural, and cultural legacy of the New York City coastal area.

GOALS OF REVISIONS

- Provide clearer definition of historic resources.
- Promote provision of tie-up for historic vessels.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

- Adds “vessels” to list of designated historic resources to protect. Also expands list of resources to include those formally eligible for , or contained within a district listed on, the National and/or State Register of Historic Places; Interior Landmarks, Scenic Landmarks, or properties within a designated New York City Historic District; Resources calendared for consideration as one of the above by LPC or National Historic Landmarks; and Resources not identified by one of the programs listed above but that meet their eligibility requirements (see Chapter 9 of the CEQR technical manual). - Adds provision for waterfront programming: “Promote public awareness of New York’s waterfront through educational and cultural facilities, events, and programming.” (10.1 D)
- Adds provision for historic vessels: “Facilitate public programming of historic resources through such measures as provision of tie-up space for historic vessels.” (10.1 E)
