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INTRODUCTION

The annual Statements of Community District Needs (CD Needs Statements) and the Community Board Budget Requests (Budget Requests) are Charter requirements and an integral part of the City's budget process. When developed through informed planning and careful consideration, CD Needs Statements and Budget Requests can play an important role in consultations of community boards with agencies, elected officials and other key stakeholders on a broad range of local planning and budget priorities. These tools also provide a valuable public resource for neighborhood planning and research purposes, and are used by a wide audience seeking information about New York City's diverse communities.

This year, for the first time, community boards electronically submitted a CD Needs Statement combined with their Budget Requests. The goal of these improvements is to simplify preparation of both documents for the community boards and to make the information community boards provide more easily accessible for City agencies and other stakeholders. Simplified and more efficient processes will allow all parties involved in the budget process to consider budget decisions more thoroughly, with better results for all New Yorkers.

This report represents Queens Community Board 8's Statement of Community District Needs and Community Board Budget Requests for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017. This report contains the formatted but otherwise unedited content provided by the Community Board which is displayed in italics.

2. OVERVIEW OF COMMUNITY DISTRICT

Queens Community Board 8 provided the following overview of their district:

Community Board 8, Queens is bounded by the Long Island Expressway to the north, Hillside Avenue to the south, Van Wyck Expressway to the west, and the Clearview Expressway to the east. It includes the communities of Briarwood, Flushing Suburban, Flushing Heights, Fresh Meadows, Hillcrest, Hillcrest Estates, Holliswood, Jamaica Estates, Jamaica Hills, Kew Gardens Hills, Utopia and West Cunningham Park. These communities are overwhelmingly residential with several commercial strips.

There are over 150,000 residents of Community Board 8. There has been a moderate but steady increase in population. Our residents are mostly middle income, multi-ethnic, multi-racial who own their own homes and co-ops or are renting. The residences consist of one and two-family homes, garden apartments, large apartment buildings such as the Fresh Meadows Development and Cunningham Heights, co-ops such as Electchester, Hilltop Village and Parkway Village. Our district also houses the New York City Housing Authority complex - Pomonok. It is important to understand that our population, as counted by the Census does not accurately represent the need for services in our district. Queens College, CUNY Law School, St. John's University, Lander College for Men are located within our borders. Thousands of students who are not counted by the US Census reside in our community while attending College/University from the months of August through May, The services that we receive should reflect those needs. The Community Board 8 residents are concerned with quality of life issues, upgrading the infrastructure, personal safety and security, education and maintaining their fair share of City services.

TRANSPORTATION - Many of our roads are not in good condition. We continue to request increased asphalt allocation for street resurfacing. Some of our roads are sinking and need to be reconstructed. To this end, we are asking for increased funding for trench restoration. We request stand-alone funding for curb installation and replacement. There has been a backlog for curb repair and curb installation for over a decade. Currently, DOT repairs curbs only where there is a sidewalk violation. Instead of repairing their own sidewalks within 45 days of receiving the notice of violation, homeowners choose to wait for DOT contractors to do the work. This is the only way to ensure that DOT repairs their curbs. As a result, sidewalks remain damaged for a longer period of time and the danger to the pedestrians is also prolonged. In addition, this will cost the City more funds for lawsuits.

BUILDING - Much of Community Board 8's housing stock is residential, with many one-family and two-family dwellings. Additional Buildings Department inspectors are necessary to enforce existing regulations and address quality of life violations. DOB introduced the Development Challenge Process initiative a few years ago. Additional plan examiners are needed to review and respond to these challenges and the many requests that we receive for audits. In addition, more plan examiners would eliminate the self-certification by architects and engineers. We receive our share of illegal conversion and illegal occupancy complaints. The lack of affordable regulated housing is the root cause of the prevalence of illegal apartments. There are very few rent stabilized apartments within Community District 8.

SANITATION - Although Community Board 8 has relatively clean streets, we have issues that need attention. With the steady increase in population, our superintendent must receive the support necessary to address our sanitation issues:

- Streets that are not covered by Street Cleaning Regulations need to be cleaned regularly.*
- The paved center malls require year-round cleaning and more frequent seasonal weed-control.*
- Retain the five day-a-week pick-ups at public schools and extra pick-up at Pomonok Houses.*
- Sanitation Police are needed for night patrol to discourage illegal dumping, especially on abandoned homes.*
- Additional agents for Sanitation Code Enforcement are needed to address the quality of life complaints that we receive. While the enforcement issues for residential properties are addressed, we noticed that enforcement of our commercial establishments is insufficient. While we do not want to stifle business by fining our small business owners some of them are repeat offenders who show a total disregard for the community. The issuance of fines is the only way to receive cooperation.*
- Unlike other community boards, CB8 has no dedicated pick-up truck for litter baskets for our commercial areas. This must be provided to ensure the cleanliness of our commercial strips in addition to more baskets (especially on Hillside Avenue). The Adopt-a-Basket program must be better promoted to encourage public and private sector partnerships.*
- Dedicated bulk pick-up trucks for large apartment/co-operative developments.*

2. OVERVIEW OF COMMUNITY DISTRICT

Queens Community Board 8 provided the following overview of their district:

SENIORS/YOUTH/EDUCATION/LIBRARIES - A civilization is best judged by the way it treats its most vulnerable members (seniors and youth). We have seen an increase in the youth and senior population from 2000 to present, as such, increase for services is needed. Increased funding for afterschool programs, summer youth employment, senior transportation services, NORCs are needed. Our schools must have the necessary equipment (smart boards, computers etc.) for our students to compete. The library has become the place to do homework for those who do not have access to computers and/or the internet at home.

3. MAIN ISSUES

As part of this year's process, community boards were asked to select from a list the three most pressing issues facing their district. Queens Community Board 8 identified the following three issues:

- *Parks*
- *Street conditions*
- *Street flooding*

Queens Community Board 8 provided the following explanation for their choices:

PARKS - Cunningham Park is Community Board 8's major park and as such is heavily utilized. throughout the year it is used for events that bring as many as a thousand of patrons (i.e. Big Apple Circus, Movies in the Parks, Shakespeare, CB8's Annual Health Fair) in addition to its daily use by our residents and those from surrounding neighborhoods/districts. Working in conjunction with the Friends of Cunningham Park, we have prioritized our requests for the rehabilitation of Cunningham Park. The 193rd Street playground located within the park needs to be rehabilitated. In addition, maintaining Cunningham Park is most important. To this end the personnel needs the following equipment: a tractor, a crew cab (with dump and plow) and a Polar Trac™ system.

FLOODING - The residents of Fresh Meadows, Utopia, Hillcrest and Kew Gardens Hills are very concerned with the water table rising and inadequate sewer systems. In recent years, there have been many water main installation and upgrade and very few sewer projects. We have requested installation of new sewer lines along Hillside Avenue for many years. Hillside Avenue is a low lying area bordering Holliswood, Jamaica Estates, Jamaica Hill and Briarwood. The F train, which is the only subway line that services our district was totally flooded a few years ago after a rainstorm. Many residents have no other way of getting into Manhattan. This also affected the businesses along Hillside Avenue. Hillside Avenue from 197th Street to 195th Street is flooded with water after each rainfall. There is just nowhere for the water to go.

TRENCH RESTORATION - Many of our roads need trench restoration. Last year, 179th Street from Union Turnpike to 75th Avenue sunk and the Department of Environmental Protection had to do costly emergency repairs. In advance of this our office received complaints about street depression. Our sewers are very old. With each passing vehicle and delivery truck, pressure is added to them causing break and undermining of the street. We asked for funding for trench restoration for several locations, which have been on our list for many years.

According to the US Census of 2010, there were over 20,000 individuals within our district that were 62 years old and over. This is an increase from the previous census taken in 2000. There are many benefits to seniors aging in place: 1) Keeping a familiar environment 2) Fostering Community Continuity 3) Maintaining their social networks 4) Strengthening of family ties 5) Fostering both their physical and mental wellbeing We do not have any NORCs for our residents who reside in apartment buildings nor NORCs (WOW) for our 1-2 family residences within our district. We want our seniors to remain in their neighborhoods and the NORCs facilitate the desire of many seniors to age in place. These are done through the multi-faceted services that they provide.

Water runoff and flooding is the most important infrastructure and City service issue that our district is facing. While most of our streets are kept clean and CD8 score cards are better than many other districts, there is room for improvement. This is especially true of our commercial strips (Hillside Avenue and Queens Boulevard). While we commend our Superintendent for doing the very best with his limited resources, we are asking that he receives more support from the Department. We are asking for more bins (i.e. the new trio of garbage, paper and bottle recycling bins) for the district. With the addition of these new bins, he will need more support to empty them on a regular basis. For this, he needs at least a dedicated truck to empty these bins. We were told that the dedicated truck will be provided within the agency's existing budget; however, we have yet to see this added resource. Keep in mind that people come from all over to get to the Jamaica Estates 179th Street/Hillside Avenue station by many bus lines to board the F train to Manhattan. It is a transportation hub. Our bins fill up quickly with coffee cups in the morning, and all sorts of litter throughout the day. When they overflow our streets are littered.

Main Issue

Roadway maintenance

The Community Board provided the following explanation for the above issue:

Community Board 8 residents rely mostly on the maintenance of the streets for travel. Only a small portion of the community can walk to a subway station to get to school, work or anywhere else. Most of the district is in a two fare zone. As of late, we have had many projects that disturbed our roads (i.e. Department of Design and Construction Projects QED989, QED 1001 etc.). Roads slated for resurfacing during the previous season had to be postponed. After the completion of these water main replacement projects, the DDC often does patch work. As you know, we had a terrible winter this past year which exacerbated the poor conditions of our roads. We need additional funding for resurfacing more linear miles of road than in previous years, as many streets were not resurfaced as planned.
