


HUNTERS POINT: Neighborhood Character and Land Use



Hunters Point is a patchwork of residences, small businesses, local retail, and public institutions, with many buildings dating from the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The array of uses is at a very fine grain, with most blocks containing multiple residential, industrial, community facility and commercial uses.



A variety of warehouse, industrial service and light manufacturing businesses are interspersed throughout the neighborhood. These include building contractors, such as elevator repair companies and small graphic printing shops.



There are also sizable clusters of late nineteenth century and early twentieth century row houses and multi-story apartment buildings primarily located on the midblocks.

There are notable emblematic buildings, cultural institutions, public facilities, and open spaces throughout the neighborhood.
