CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Mr. DiBenedetto thanked Mr. Budabin for his service as Chair. Mr. DiBenedetto introduced Mr. Dadras as First Vice Chair, Mr. Euler as Second Vice Chair and Ms. Martino as Third Vice Chair. Mr. DiBenedetto spoke regarding his goals has Board Chair. There were two committee meetings and there will be a CB11 Budget Committee meeting this month.

BOARD MEMBER NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Euler gave an update on open cases with the Board of Standards and Appeals (BSA). The application to convert the bays of a Mobil gas station into a fast-food express establishment was discussed. The Principal of Francis Lewis High spoke at the BSA public hearing with concerns that students would leave the school to race across the boulevard to order food at the new proposed establishment. CB11 voted in favor of the application. Mr. Euler asked if there was something that could be done.

Mr. Galatan spoke regarding the construction of the Vanderbilt Motor Parkway. He discussed the possibility of conducting a run through the Vanderbilt Motor Parkway. Mr. Galatan suggested a Government Affairs Committee meeting to discuss Local Law 97.

Ms. Collado spoke regarding the LIRR and the recent changes. She made a second request for a meeting to discuss this problem. Mr. Dadras said this will be discussed at the next Transportation Committee meeting. The March meeting had a full agenda.

Mr. Montgomery said that the Osprey landing has been installed behind the end of 233rd Street.

Ms. Burke said New Yorkers for Parks has released a 1% for Parks Impact Report which can be obtained at www.ny4p.com. She discussed how Crochron Park has a view of the bay and once the trees fully bloom the view of no longer be visible.

Mr. Hadjiconstantinou said that the LIRR will be changing their timetable in May.

Ms. Sriram asked for the provider of the shelter on Northern Blvd. Mr. Marziliano said Good Samaritan is the provider.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Transportation – Mr. Dadras, Committee Chair, said that each Board Member received a five-page report outlining everything that was discussed at the March 23, 2023, Committee meeting. Mr. Dadras reviewed nine items listed in the report. The issue regarding the LIRR will be discussed at the next meeting. Discussion ensued regarding tow operations. Members also discussed safety measures at local schools regarding parents double and triple parking at drop off and pick up. Mr. Fried, Community Police Council President, said that the 111th precinct is working on this matter. Ms. As a said that CM Lee is working with the local Principals and the Dept. of Transportation (DOT). P.S. 203 will be excluded because it is located on an evacuation route. Ms. Ziraschi stated that she just received notice from the DOT that they will be adding street lighting at LIRR to Northern Blvd.

Joint Parks and Public Relations – Mr. DiBenedetto, Parks Committee Chair, and Ms. Martino, Public Relations Committee Chair, discussed the joint committee meeting of March 20, 2023. Mr. DiBenedetto reviewed the Committee report of March 20, 2023, by discussing Community There is one within the boundaries of CB11, Pembroke Garden. The Committee was hoping to establish additional gardens. Ms. Martino asked for ideas to engage the community. She was thinking of doing another meet and greet for Board Members.

Mr. DiBenedetto spoke regarding Mr. Euler's request to support the BSA application for the Mobil Station. Mr. Marziliano said the Board approved the application and there is no official way to reopen the recommendation. Discussion ensued on how to reopen the application process. Mr. DiBenedetto requested the principal register to speak at next month's meeting. The request to rescind the approval, if it could be done, must go to committee and then the full Board. It is, at least, a two-week process. Mr. Marziliano will look further into this matter.
