### CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The scheduled committee meetings were announced. Mr. Budabin said April 1<sup>st</sup> there will be new Board Members, and some may choose not to renew. He thanked all the Board Members for their service.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

East Flushing Zoning Committee – ULURP #C220218ZMQ – 189-10 Northern Blvd. – An application to the Dept. of City Planning which seeks a zoning map amendment from the Dept. of City Planning (DCP) to rezone 189-02, 189-08, 189-14, 190-10, 191-20 Northern Blvd. and 43-17 189 Street (Block 5513, Lots 8. 10, 11, 12, 22, 27 and a portion of 5) from R3X and R3-2 zoning districts to R3X/C2-3 and R3-2/C2-3 zoning districts. Mr. Budabin, Acting Committee Chair, said this application would add a commercial overlay on all or a portion of the lots included in the application. This proposed amendment will facilitate the development of a new three-story plus cellar mixed-use, commercial and community facility building. The building will be approximately 40' high with a total of 35 parking spaces. The Committee made a motion to approve the application. The Committee voted against the application by 2 in favor and 2 opposed. There were 3 registered public speakers; (1) Ann Avalos spoke in opposition of this application stating that any building could be built without community input. She discussed parking and how there are buildings adjacent that are vacant, therefore, the need for this building is lacking, (2) Lina Vrachnis spoke in opposition of this application stating that this proposal will take away from the nature of the area, (3) Paul Graziano spoke in opposition of this application stating that this applicant is bypassing a variance and is choosing to apply for a zoning change. The applicant's representative, Richard Lobel, gave a presentation. Mr. Lobel said that this block is the only block in a 25-block stretch of Northern Blvd. that is not commercially zoned. He stated that there will be approximately 85 parking spaces with a parking lot that will remain. There will be retail space on the first floor, office space on the second and a community facility on the third. Mr. Budabin made a motion to approve the application. The motion was seconded by Mr. Popa. There was Board Member discussion. Mr. Euler stated that this applicant should seek a Board of Standards and Appeals (BSA) variance. The community does not want a rezoning of the area. Currently. their site is in poor condition and not maintained. Mr. Popa said that in the future, this will be a public transportation intersection and there must be a balance for businesses and residents. Budabin said that he is sympathetic to residents that want to maintain community control by the variance process. Northern Blvd. is a commercial corridor. Mr. Budabin said he is also sympathetic to business owners that want to be able to develop in our community. DiBenedetto said that a zoning change is not needed, and this will allow for overdevelopment. Ms. James spoke regarding the parking lot on the block and how if the application passes, an asof-right structure could be built on that lot. Mr. Hadjiconstantinou stated that he does not see the negative impact of this application since this area is already a commercial thruway. Mr. Lobel gave a few points; the choice of not going to BSA, this application does not fit the findings for a variance; the rezoning conforms to the area. Mr. Turner said that he agrees with Mr. Lobel and that new businesses must be allowed if they are needed. Mr. Montgomery wanted to remind the Board of the Douglaston project at Northern Blvd. and Douglaston Parkway and how it changed the neighborhood. A roll call vote was taken resulting in 10 in favor, 27 opposed and 2 present. The motion was denied.

North Bayside Zoning Committee - ULURP #C210323 MMQ - 43 Avenue Demapping. An application for an amendment to the City Map involving the elimination, discontinuance and closing (demapping) of 1,559 square foot portion of 43 Avenue between 222 Street and 223 Street and adjustment of grades and block dimensions necessitated. Ms. Lanzetta, Committee Chair, stated that this application is to eliminate the encroachment of a retaining wall. There were no registered public speakers. The applicant's representative, Joseph Sabro, gave a presentation. This will be on the south side of 43 Avenue between 222 and 223 Streets. The applicant is the owner of 222-08 43 Avenue, this property and the adjacent property have a retaining wall that encroaches on 43 Avenue. Without resolving the encroachment, the applicant is not able to obtain a C of O or resolve violations. The applicant is seeking this application to correct the violations and obtain a C of O. There are plans to build and repair the retaining wall. The Committee made a motion to approve the application. The motion failed. The Committee also discussed the traffic on 43 Avenue. A motion was made to the approve the application by Mr. Popa. The motion was There was Board Member discussion. Mr. Popa stated that the seconded by Ms. Garippa. retaining wall does not encroach onto the street. The street and sidewalk will stay the same. The greenery will stay the same. He said there is no impact on traffic. He was confused as to way the Committee voted against the proposal. Mr. Mihaltses said that in 2005 the owner built the retaining The wall was built knowing it was encroaching on City property. He also discussed the bottleneck traffic flow on 43 Avenue. To approve this application will set a precedent that anyone can build on City property. He said the owner can seek a revocable consent to allow it to be there or rebuild and have DOB approve the wall. Mr. Montgomery said the wall never should have been built; it was built on City property. Discussion ensued regarding how this should have been built the right way. It was clarified that the retaining wall was built in 2005 not 1996. A roll call vote was taken resulting in 0 in favor, 39 opposed, 2 present.

Stephan Popa was nominated for Chair by Mr. Turner. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Kelly. Mr. Popa declined the nomination. He will be resigning from the Board. There were no other nominations. There was one vote cast by Ms. Scherer for Paul DiBenedetto.

Mr. DiBenedetto will be the Chair starting April 1, 2023.

Victor Dadras was nominated for 1st Vice Chair by Mr. DiBenedetto. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Guidice. Mr. Dadras accepted the nomination. Ms. Donahue nominated Henry Euler. Mr. Euler declined the nomination by saying that he supports Mr. Dadras. There were no other nominations. One vote was cast by Mr. Popa to re-elect Victor Dadras. Mr. Dadras will continue his role as 1st Vice Chair.

Henry Euler was nominated for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair by Ms. Scherer. The motion was seconded by Ms. Guidice. Mr. Euler accepted the nomination. Eileen Miller was nominated for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair by Ms. Cerezo. The motion was seconded by Mr. Jethwani. Ms. Miller accepted the nomination. Ms. Miller introduced herself. Mr. Euler introduced himself. There were no other nominations. An electronic ballot was collected resulting in 31 for Mr. Euler and 8 for Ms. Miller. Mr. Euler will be 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair starting April 1, 2023.
