## **CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT**

The CB11 Office will be closed Tuesday in observation of Election Day. The CB11 Office will also be closed on Friday in observation of Veteran's Day. On October 10<sup>th</sup> there was a Transportations Committee meeting. On October 25<sup>th</sup> there was a Capital and Expense Committee meeting. Today was the ribbon cutting for the Vanderbilt Motor Parkway. A letter was sent to the Dept. of Transportation as a follow up from the October General meeting. On November 11<sup>th</sup>

the Bayside Historical Society with the Bayside Hills Civic Association is conducting an event to honor Captain Dermody at the Captain Dermody Triangle.

### **BOARD MEMBER NEW BUSINESS**

Mr. Euler spoke regarding the new proposal by the Mayor 's "The City of Yes". He said that City Planning will be explaining this to the Board.

Ms. Scherer spoke regarding compost bin provided by DSNY.

Ms. Martino spoke regarding a possible blood drive at KCS. She asked that Board Members that are interested in helping to please sign-up.

Mr. Dadras stated that the Douglas LDC is conducting a food drive on Sunday, November 19<sup>th</sup>. that will provide a shopping bag of food for those in need of Thanksgivings dinner.

### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

**Capital & Expense Budget Committee** – Paul DiBenedetto, Committee Chair discussed the additions and adjustments. He said that one item is the bike lane on Northern Blvd. This stretch needs improvement. The request was made to improve this area making it more a greenway with a bike lane. The barriers are a hazard. Currently, the request is for the bike lane to be move to the sidewalk. DOT has stated that this cannot be done. Mr. Galatan was favor of revising the request. A motion was made by Mr. Mamak to approve the change. The motion was seconded by Ms. James. Mr. Giusetti felt that there should be more community input. Mr. DiBenedetto stated that this is not a new request, it is a revised request. The request will read "Provide a shared pedestrian/bicycle greenway on the north sidewalk of Northern Blvd. between Douglaston Parkway to 223<sup>rd</sup> Street to enhance safety. Between the Cross Island Parkway and Douglaston Parkway the NYCDOT's has a 5-foot-wide sidewalk. The work requires removing 2,500 +/- feet of existing sidewalk and building an 11 +/- foot wide pedestrian/bicycle lane with existing 4 +/- foot curb strip as a traffic buffer. Bridge widening is not recommended. Use cautionary signs at the bridge and all driveways and obstructions. Remove and replace fences, shrubs, scrub trees, fill and grade and relocate two lighting standards. No major trees are affected." Ms. Miller said on Wednesday, August 30, 2022, the CB11 Transportation Committee met via Zoom to review and discuss NYC DOT's revised proposal for Bicycle Lane Network Development in Community Board 11. After discussion, a motion was made to recommend DOT's revised Bicycle Lane Development plan as presented. A roll call vote was taken resulting in 5 yes and 8 no. The motion failed. At the Full board meeting of September 12, 2022, after discussion, A motion was presented to recommend DOT's revised Bicycle Lane Development plan as presented. The motion was denied. This should be noted that CB11 did not vote in favor of the proposed bike lanes.

A roll call vote was taken resulting in 31 in favor and 1 opposed. The motion carried.

### **Virtual Meeting Special Allowance – for disabled and caregiver Board Members**

General Counsel from the Borough President's office advised that members would be able to vote and count towards a quorum. Half of the Board Members must be present for a quorum. If half is not present, the remote members do not count. The public will also be allowed to join under zoom. A resolution was reviewed, and Ms. Mazza made corrections. A questions and answer period followed. Ms. James asked what happens if there is no quorum and the time of essence will expire before the next general meeting. Mr. Marziliano stated that a vote would have to be taken. A motion was made to approve the resolution with the corrections by Ms. Mazza. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hadjiconstantinou. A roll call vote was taken resulting in 29 on favor and 3 opposed. The motion carried.
