7:35pm PUBLIC HEARING RE: CITYWIDE HEALTH AND FITNESS ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT (a/k/a Physical Culture Establishments) ULURP # N210382ZRY

Presentation by Joy Chen, Queens Planner, NYC Dept. of City Planning

Currently gyms, martial arts studios, spas, licensed massage therapists and many other health-related businesses require a Special Permit from the NY City Board of Standards and Appeals to open in most parts of New York City. The Department of City Planning is proposing new rules to ease these restrictions. Under this proposed zoning text amendment, the special permit requirements would be removed. The BSA process for obtaining a permit can be extremely costly, often adding 6 months and as much as \$50,000. in startup costs to open a gym or other physical culture establishment.
