VA News: VA Immediately Processing Terminally Ill Veterans' PACT Act Claims



The VA is now processing **PACT Act** benefits claims for terminally ill Veterans **three weeks ahead** of the planned original start date. Out of the more than 175,000 claims already received by the VA, nearly 2,500 of them have been filed by Veterans who are terminally ill.

The decision to begin processing early was made by **VA Secretary Denis McDonough**. "These Veterans have stepped up to serve our country in the times when we needed them most – and now, it's our job to step up for them," said Secretary McDonough.

The VA will begin processing all PACT Act benefits claims on **January 1st**, **2022** and will prioritize terminally ill Veterans, followed by Veterans with cancer, Veterans experiencing homelessness, Veterans older than 85 years old, Veterans experiencing financial hardship, and Veterans who have received the Medal of

Honor or a Purple Heart.

NYC Civil Service Job Openings and Exams



You served your country. Now serve your city!

Do your part to keep the city running! The NYC Department of Citywide
Administrative Services (DCAS) makes City government work for all New Yorkers.

There are many diverse career opportunities with NYC DCAS.

Veterans are no longer required to pay application fees for NYC Civil Service examinations.

And Veteran Spouses are now eligible for a one-time application fee waiver for NYC Civil Service examinations.

See below for open competitive NYC Civil Service exam highlights:

Open Competitive Exams

Correction Officer - Officers maintain security and are responsible for the care, custody, control, job training and work performance of sentenced and detained inmates within New York City correctional facilities.

Police Officer - Officers patrol an assigned area on foot or in a vehicle to prevent crime; apprehend crime suspects; intervene in various situations involving crimes in progress, aided cases, complaints, emotionally disturbed persons, etc.; respond to and investigate vehicular accidents; investigate specific offenses; interact with prisoners; operate and maintain patrol vehicles; issue summonses; obtain information regarding incidents by interviewing witnesses, victims, and/or complainants; safeguard and voucher found, seized or recovered property; provide information to the public; handle situations involving maltreated, abused, or missing children; interact with juveniles; may be assigned to crowd control for large-scale events such as demonstrations, rallies and parades; prepare forms and reports; and testify in court.

Traffic Control Inspector - Inspectors conduct field inspections and surveys of traffic-related conditions for the purpose of regulating and controlling traffic, and installing/removing traffic signs, traffic signals, and other traffic control devices; inspect the completed work of contractors to ensure compliance with established standards and specifications; prepare work orders based upon field conditions; investigate complaints relating to heavy trucking, improper parking, lack of traffic signals or loading zones; check volume of traffic and report on potential problems associated with visibility, grading and line of sight; study accident reports and make observations at the scene of accidents to determine causal pattern; study the effect of converting two-way streets into one-way streets; and drive a vehicle to work assignments.
