The event kicked off with the <u>United War Veterans Council (UWVC)</u> announcing Elana Duffy as an Honorary Marshall for this year's Veterans Day Parade.

Next up was a performance from the <u>Old Guard Drum and Fife Corps</u> the only unit of its kind in the U.S. Armed Forces and which has played at every Presidential Inaugural Parade since John F. Kennedy.

After the rousing display, New York City and DVS issued a proclamation commemorating the event and cementing the City's commitment to making itself Veteran and servicemember friendly.

In a stunning show of precision and artistry, the <u>U.S. Army Drill Team</u> executed a 5 minute performance wielding M1903 Springfields like batons.

The celebration then transitioned into an Oath of Enlistment ceremony for 5 future soldiers: representing each NYC borough. Each enlistee also received a citation honoring their passion and commitment to serving this nation.

The festivities ended with cake from Brooklyn's BCakeNY and songs from <u>West Point's</u> <u>Benny Havens Band</u>.



Biggest Troop Pay Raise in 2 Decades on Track in House Defense Bill



By Rebecca Kheel Published: Jun. 12, 2023 WASHINGTON DC (Military.com) - Service members would get a 5.2% pay raise next year under the House Armed Services Committee's draft of the annual defense policy bill, the committee confirmed Monday.

Including the raise in the committee's version of the National Defense Authorization Act, or NDAA, puts troops on track to receive their highest pay raise in more than two decades.

The 5.2% pay bump matches what the Biden administration proposed in its fiscal 2024 budget request, which in turn matched a federal formula that ties annual military raises to growth in private-sector wages.

While the NDAA has months to go and multiple steps before it becomes law, lawmakers traditionally follow or exceed the administration's requested pay raise for troops. [READ MORE...]

Patriotic Written Essay Competition Grand Prize: \$5,000 Award

What is the Patriot's Pen Program?

Conducted nationwide, this VFW-sponsored youth essay competition gives students an opportunity to write essays expressing their views on an annual patriotic theme. We invite you to join the more than 73,000 students who participated last year in this contest.

Why Should I Enter?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, State and national level. Department (State) winners receive a portion of \$55,000 in national awards. National Winners will receive at least \$500. The first-place national award is currently \$5,000.

The Internal Revenue Service requires a recipient awarded more than \$599 be given Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable income. This may require the winner to provide their social security number.

How Does the Contest Work?

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post.

The contest consists of four levels. The first level (entry) is sponsored by VFW Posts. Post winners advance, one for every 15 entries, to the VFW District (regional) level where the one first-place winner is advanced to the VFW Department (state) level. The first-place winner at the Department level is then advanced into the VFW national competition.

Who Can Enter?

Patriot's Pen is open to 6th, 7th and 8th-grade students enrolled by the Oct. 31 deadline in public, private or parochial schools in the U.S., its territories or its possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Home-schooled students also are eligible. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. (Foreign exchange students or former winners that placed in the National contest are ineligible.)

How Do I Get Started?

- Ask a teacher or youth group/club adult leader to supervise the Patriot's Pen writing contest.
- Contact a participating VFW Post and indicate your interest in participating.

 Establish a contact person who is a member of that VFW Post or its VFW Auxiliary.

 Make sure that your essay is submitted to the VFW Post before the contest deadline of October 31, 2023. You can submit your essay and entry form by email upon the Post's approval. Entries sent to the VFW National Headquarters directly will be returned.

How Am I Judged?

Knowledge of the theme is worth 30 points: You must show a thorough knowledge of the theme in your work. Demonstrate you have researched the issue extensively.

Theme development is worth 35 points: Answer all relevant facts about the theme such as the who,

what, where, when and why. Relate the theme to your own experiences.

Clarity of ideas is worth 35 points:

Write your essay in an easy-to-understand format. Leave your reader with a clear understanding of your explanation of the theme.

What Is the Theme?

VFW's Commander-in-Chief annually chooses the year's theme. The 2023-2024 theme is:

"How are you inspired by America?"

Deadline Information.

To qualify, all entries must be submitted to a sponsoring VFW Post by midnight October 31, 2023.



Open Competitive Exams

New York City Bridge Exam Program - This examination is open to all candidates who wish to apply for and meet the requirements for any one or more of the titles indicated: Bookkeeper, Clerical Associate, Clerical Associate (PRO), Clerical Associate (NYC H+H), Clerical Associate (NYC H+H)(PRO), Computer Service Technician, Maintenance Worker (CUNY), Maintenance Worker (NYC H+H), Secretary, Staff Analyst Trainee.

Watershed Maintainer - Watershed Maintainers utilize computerized, electronic and mechanical equipment to perform duties related to the operation, maintenance, repair and

inspection of facilities, roads, bridges, equipment and lands in the watershed areas including reservoirs, aqueducts and groundwater, water and wastewater treatment and related systems of The City of New York; ensure compliance with applicable federal, state, local and Agency environmental health and safety laws, policies and procedures; operate motor vehicles and motor-powered equipment. All Watershed Maintainers perform related work.

Estimator (General Construction) - Estimators perform general construction estimating work of varying degrees of difficulty and responsibility. They may operate a motor vehicle to visit sites. Some of the physical activities performed by Estimators and environmental conditions experienced are: walking to and from inspection sites; climbing and descending from ladders or stairs to get to areas to be inspected; standing for extended periods of time; bending and stooping during inspections; working in confined areas; communicating orally; carrying clipboards and inspection forms; climbing around and over various objects; walking in areas that may be damp, dark, dusty, smoky or acrid; and working outdoors in all kinds of weather.
