WHY IS MY WATER BEING TURNED OFF?

The NYC Department of Design and Construction is managing the capital construction project along Grand Street between Bowery and Essex Street. The test water shutdown is anticipated to begin at 9PM and last for approximately **Eight (8)** hours. On occasion, this work may be completed earlier and water service restored. This is done to make sure that the valves that turn the water on and off in the street are working properly. If the test is successful, the contractor will then request a full water main shut down in order to *perform the required water main work*. This type of operation usually begins at 8:00am and last for approximately eight hours. You will be given advance notification of when this will occur.

SOME THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- The DDC recommends that you shut off the water main valve in your house/building in order to avoid problems that may occur if/when sediment enters or is released from your plumbing. Such sediment may clog the screen to the water meter or make *flushometers* inoperable.
- You are asked to shut off all WATER cooled appliances, which may include industrial air conditioners, large refrigeration devices, etc.
- Once water service is restored, turn the main house valve back on and flush the system by running your faucets, sinks and tubs, for a few minutes.
