Juvenile Counselors work in detention facilities that are operated by the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS). Juvenile Counselors provide day-to-day direct care, supervision, and counseling to New York City youth who are detained by the Family and Criminal Courts. Working with at-risk youth, this position requires a strong sense of commitment, integrity, and resilience. We are looking for exceptional candidates who are passionate about working with young people and want to make a positive difference in their lives.

To qualify for the position, candidates must have the following Education and Experience requirements:

- 1) A four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent, plus four years of full-time satisfactory experience working directly with youths (ages 10-18) or developmentally disabled adults or adolescents (age 10 or up) in a group, community, educational, or institutional setting; or
- 2) An associate degree from an accredited college or university, or completion of 60 semester credits of study at an accredited college or university, plus two years of full-time satisfactory experience working directly with youths (ages 10-18) or developmentally disabled adults or adolescents (age 10 or up) in a group, community, educational, or institutional setting; or
- 3) A baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university; or
- 4) A satisfactory combination of education and/or experience that is equivalent to “1”, “2”, or “3”, above. Experience may be substituted for education on the basis that one year of full-time satisfactory experience as described in “2” above is equated to 30 college semester credits. However, all candidates must possess a four-year high school diploma or its educational equivalent.s.
