The DOE engages in an extensive review process to ensure that all students will receive a high-quality pre-kindergarten education in a safe, secure environment.

EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT PSYCHOLOGICAL MALTREATMENT:

DEFINITION, ASSESSMENT, INCIDENCE AND IMPACT, JUNE 20

The American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children-New York (APSAC-NY) and The Child Abuse Medical Provider Program (CHAMP) will be hosting a webcast titled the **Everything You Need to Know about Psychological Maltreatment: Definition, Assessment, Incidence and Impact** on Friday, June 20, 2014. This webcast will present the consensus definition of psychological maltreatment endorsed by the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children (APSAC) along with detailed examples of the various expressions of parental/caregiving behaviors that constitute psychological maltreatment. UPK IDENTIFICATION NUMBER IN WES

Programs will now be able to view, enter, and edit an UPK child's student identification number on the Attendance roster in WES. This nine-digit number, also known as the OSIS number, is supplied by the Department of Education when an UPK child is entered and approved in DOE's PreKIDS system. A preliminary match was done by ACS and DOE and matched OSIS numbers were added to children's records in WES. Please review these numbers with April attendance. Programs need to add any OSIS numbers that are currently missing for any of their UPK children. (Add or edit number within OSIS field and remember to SAVE the page when done with changes.)

ADDITIONAL FIELDS IN WES FOR CONTRACTOR AND PROGRAMS

Additional contact and information fields have been added in WES for Contractor and Program profiles. Simply click on "Contractor Profile" (if Super User) and/or "Program Profile", from the drop-down menu and select "details". Additional information in the profile can now be added, edited and saved. Please take a moment to review, correct, and complete this information so that the system accurately reflects contact information (including email addresses!) for Board Chair, Program Directors, and emergency contact. Additionally, you should update information such as program's hours of operations, nearby transportation and languages spoken.

HEAD START

PROGRAM INFORMATION REPORT 2012—2013

The Program Information Report (PIR) is an annual federal report that collects program level data describing children and families enrolled in Head Start and the services provided including information on staff, characteristics of enrolled children and families, health services (medical, dental, mental health), services to children with disabilities, and family services. The 2012-2013 PIR covers a period coinciding with the first 9 months of *EarlyLearn NYC*. Programs reporting were those with Head Start and/or Dual models.
