**-- Deputy Commissioner of Early Care and
Education Myung Lee To Leave ACS --**

I wanted to share with you that Myung Lee, Deputy Commissioner of the Division of Early Care and Education (ECE), will be leaving ACS to join Cities of Service as its new Executive Director.

Myung joined ACS in January 2012 at a time when the agency was implementing major changes in early care and education. Under her skilled leadership, ACS successfully implemented *EarlyLearn NYC*, the first major transformation of the City's contracted early care and education system in over 50 years aimed at increasing the quality of early care and education services for 37,000 children at over 360 centers and in 1,400 family child care settings. She has led our efforts to secure and maintain grants from private funders to support demonstration projects including a scholarship program for contractors' staff to receive management training, a curriculum training program for home-based child care providers, and renovation of centers devastated by Hurricane Sandy. A hallmark of her tenure was the introduction of Listening Tours and other small group meetings with providers to improve customer service, to foster a better working relationship, and to hear directly from those working with children and families.

I will work with Myung to ensure a smooth transition for ECE; her last day with ACS is February 14, 2014. Please join me in thanking Myung for all of her hard work and dedication on behalf of New York City's children and families, as well as wishing her the best as she embarks on her new endeavors.

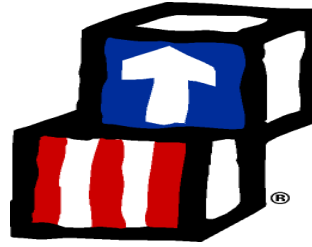

GUIDELINES TO REQUEST LETTERS OF SUPPORT FROM NEW YORK CITY'S ADMINISTRATION FOR CHILDREN'S SERVICES

The Administration for Children's Services (ACS) receives requests from provider agencies and community partners seeking letters of support to include as part of a proposal to federal, state, city, or private organizations. Requests for Letters of Support and the required supporting documentation should be submitted to ACS **TWO (2) WEEKS PRIOR** to the date the letter of support is needed to allow for the completion of an internal review process.

The request for a letter of support must include the following:

- ✓ Name of the organization making the request, phone number and email address for a contact person at the requesting agency, a description of the funding opportunity being pursued and the proposal due date.
- ✓ A summary (1-2 page maximum) of the proposed project that provides the following information:
 - Goals and objectives
 - Organizational resources/capabilities to carry out the project, if funded
 - Target population and geographic area.
- ✓ Responses to the following questions:
 - Why is your organization best suited to provide the proposed services?
 - How will your organization sustain the program after the funding ends?
- ✓ Amount of funding being requested and anticipated use of funds.

Please include *a sample letter* addressed to the potential funder for ACS to use at its discretion and modify as needed.

The following specific vendor information is also required:


- ✓ Confirmation the organization has had no serious negative VENDEX findings as it pertains to ACS or other city contracts;
- ✓ Statement that a most recent agency audit was conducted and there were no serious findings;
- ✓ Tax Identification Number and NYC Payee/Vendor Number.

Please be advised that requesting a letter of support does not guarantee that one will be issued. Each letter of support request will be considered on an individual basis.

On behalf of the "Parents to the Rescue" planning team, Happy New Year!!

We would like to thank everyone for their help in making our December 7th launch events such a success. A total of 28 participants met together at Union Settlement in East Harlem, with 27 participants meeting at Brooklyn Community Services in downtown Brooklyn. People seemed to enjoy working together on such a critical issue and left feeling heard and inspired. Many valuable suggestions were made in response to two questions, listed below;

How would you like to see the early childhood system strengthened?

- Align curriculums, goals, and benchmarks (DOE, DOH, ACS collaboration).
- Remove barriers (revisit eligibility requirements/parent fees, non-traditional hours).
- Workforce (pay equity/DOE, benefits/health insurance, professional development, streamline and reduce paperwork).
- Stabilize funding (dedicated public funding streams, foundation funding).

What would it take to make these changes a reality?

- Make parent meetings accessible (childcare, carfare).
- Develop effective parent outreach strategies (social media, telephone tree, buddy system).
- Create incentives for parent participation (rewards, social events for parents).
- Parent leadership (agenda driven by parents, identify individual interests rather than delegate tasks, provide advocacy training).
- Grassroots strategy (child care centers as community hubs, invite elected officials to parent meetings).
- Strengthen boards (advocacy training).

The East Harlem group set the next meeting date for Saturday, February 1, 2014 from 10:00-12:00. We will be providing childcare at all future meetings.

One East Harlem participant suggested that each parent invite five other parents to the next meeting. With more advanced notice this time, we are also hoping center Directors and staff will have enough time to get the word out to all of their parents. Flyers in all three major languages are attached. All are welcome to participate in the planning process and attend "Parents to the Rescue" meetings.

In the past...

Families were required to apply in person and submit paperwork at each school of interest. Some students received multiple offers, while others received no offers until June.

Reflecting Back to Move Forward

Last year, we piloted a streamlined admissions process in our elementary school choice districts--1, 7, and 23:

- Families submitted one application, ranked choices and received one offer
- Families had the option to apply:
 - Online
 - Over the phone
 - In person at an Enrollment Office
- The process worked well; we saw
 - The majority of families applied online
 - A greater percentage of families participated in kindergarten admissions in all pilot districts, allowing schools and families to plan better for the fall

2014 Kindergarten Admissions

There is a new way to submit applications. Beginning in January, all families can apply for kindergarten in one of three ways:

- Online using Kindergarten Connect at www.nyc.gov/schools/kindergarten
- Over the phone by calling 718-935-2400 (8am – 6pm, Mon – Fri)
- In person at an Enrollment Office (8am – 3pm, Mon – Fri)

Interpretation services will be provided in approximately 150 languages for the phone and in person options.

The new application process does not change schools' zones or admissions priorities.

Understanding the Process

Who should apply?

- Children who were born in 2009 and live in New York City are eligible
- All families, including those of students with disabilities and those currently in pre-k, must submit an application to receive a placement in April

What do they need to apply?

- Child's name, date of birth
- Parent/guardian name, address, phone number, email address (if applicable)
- Information on any siblings who will be in grades K-5 next year, including name, date of birth, current school, grade and OSIS
- Child's current pre-k (if applicable)
- Child's native language (if applying to a dual language program)
- The programs they are applying to, in order of preference

2014 Kindergarten Admissions Timeline

Before applying, families should:

- Learn about their zoned school
- Go to school tours and open houses
- Review information about other options
- Make decisions about school preferences

January 13 through February 14

During the application period:

- Apply online, over the phone, or in person at an Enrollment Office

April through June

After offers go out:

- Pre-register at the school, providing documentation
- If a school is able to offer your child a seat from the waitlist, they will contact you directly

Understanding School Options

1. Identify the district and zoned school

- Call 311 or use the online School Search tool at www.nyc.gov/schools/schoolsearch, where you can type in an address to identify the district and zoned school, and see other nearby schools on the map.
- There are 32 Community School Districts across all 5 boroughs.
 - Districts 1, 7 and 23 are choice districts with no zoned schools.
 - Families residing in all other districts have a zoned school where they have priority to attend.
 - In all cases, families are welcome to apply to any schools of interest throughout the city, but the schools' admissions priorities will determine which students are admitted.
- Families with a zoned school are strongly encouraged to list it on their application.

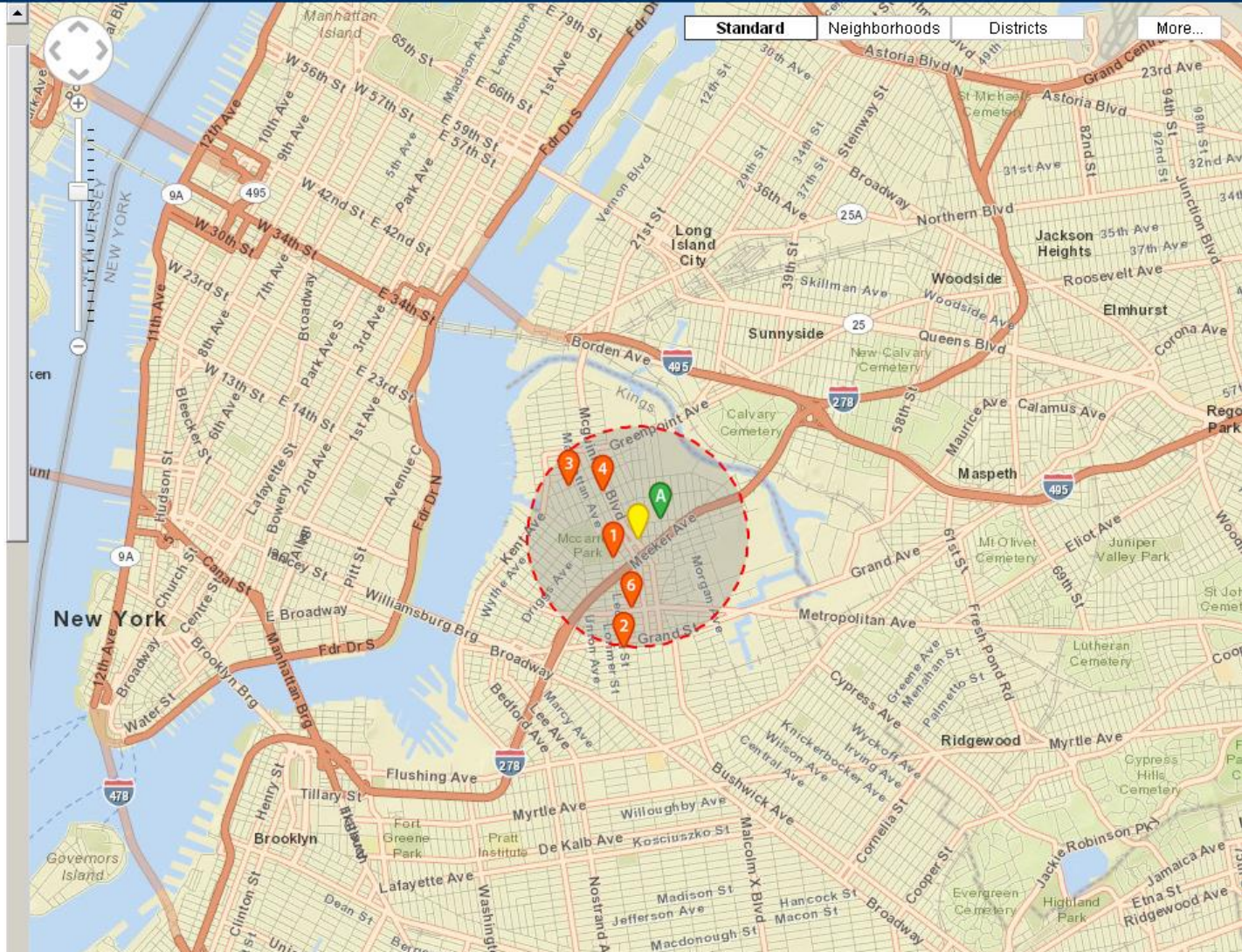

Understanding School Options

2. Review other school options and their admissions priorities. Determine what priority group a student would be in for a given school.

Standard Zoned School Admissions Priorities

1. Zoned students with siblings who will be enrolled in grades K-5 in September 2014;
2. Zoned students without siblings in the school;
3. In-district students with siblings who will be enrolled in grades K-5 in September 2014;
4. Out-of-district students with siblings who will be enrolled in grades K-5 in September 2014;
5. In-district students who are currently enrolled at the school for pre-k;
6. Out-of-district students who are currently enrolled at the school for pre-k;
7. Other in-district students;
8. Other out-of-district students.

Understanding School Options

3. Use the Directory to consider the likelihood of admission to given school.

In the directories, there is information about who from the applicant pool the school was able to accept in last year's kindergarten admissions. This can give families a sense of whether it is likely or unlikely that the school will be able to make offers to their priority group.

- We encourage all families to list their zoned school on the application.
- There is no disadvantage to ranking as many programs as you are interested in.
- You should rank programs in order of your preference. Your child's priority is determined by each school's admissions priorities, not how you rank programs.
- Students will remain on the waitlist for any programs ranked higher than the kindergarten offer they receive. Schools will contact families directly if an offer can be made.
- You should pre-register your child when you receive a kindergarten offer.
